

LELLMAN FAMILY

NB: The following is prepared from Falkland Islands Registers and files – there may be other family born outside the Falklands. Unless stated otherwise, all dated births, deaths and marriages occurred in the Falklands and all numbered graves are in Stanley Cemetery. Any variations which may occur in the spellings of names are recorded as written in the records at the time.

Francis Joseph “Joseph” LELLMAN was born in Creuznach, Germany, then known as Rhenish Prussia.

Francis, a carpenter from Germany, was married to **Ellen Sophia KING**, age 19 and born in England, 1 June 1871 at Trinity Church Stanley according to the Rites and Ceremonies of the Church of England by Banns by Charles Bull MA Colonial Chaplain. The witnesses were Frederick King, F I King Jnr, Caroline Matilda Dawson, Alice King and Isabella King. Francis' father was recorded as Francis Matthias Lellman, teacher, and Ellen's father was recorded as Frederick King, carpenter. Francis was naturalised in 1879. Joseph died 31 December 1897 and was buried in Grave D291 (*age and cause of death not recorded in burial or death registers*). According to his death notice he was 51. [CM Dec 1897] Ellen died 29 September 1910 from cancer and was buried 2 October 1910 in Grave D728.



FIRST GENERATION:

Children of Francis and Ellen LELLMAN:

1. **Boy LELLMAN** born 1871. Died a few hours old and was buried in Grave D293.
2. **Madeline Jane LELLMAN** born 27 December 1873 in Stanley. Her father's occupation was recorded as carpenter. Madeline was married to **Herbert Henry HILL**, minister of Christ, 5 January 1897 in the Baptist Tabernacle according to the Rites & Ceremonies of the Established Church by Licence by Edwin Coupland Aspinall Canon of Christ Church. The witnesses were J G Wickham Bertrand and Frederica Josephine Lellman. Herbert's father was recorded as Rowland Hill, wagon inspector.
3. **Frederica Josephine LELLMAN** born 18 February 1876 in Stanley. Her father's occupation was recorded as carpenter. Frederica was married to **William Austen THOMPSON**, colonial treasurer, 3 August 1902 in the Parish of Christ Church according to the Rites & Ceremonies of the Established Church by Licence by Lowther E Brandon MA Dean & Colonial Chaplain. The witnesses were Franz F Lellman and Cysie Lellman. William's father was recorded as Alexander James Thompson, provost master, Bahamas, West Indies. William retired in 1926.
4. **Francis/Franz Frederick/Fritz LELLMAN** born 13 May 1878 in Stanley. His father's occupation was recorded as carpenter. Franz, a painter, was married to **Margaret BINNIE** 11 October 1908 in Christ Church Cathedral by Special Licence by C Rome Hall, Assistant Cathedral Chaplain. The witnesses were Edward Beveridge Binnie, Victor Joseph Lellman and Sarah McGill. Margaret's father was recorded as William Binnie, tailor. Margaret died 15 November 1951, age 72, and is buried in Grave 1469. Francis died 15 September 1955.
5. **Albert Ferdinand LELLMAN** born 9 March 1881 in Stanley. His father's occupation was recorded as carpenter. Albert started working for the FIC Ltd in 1898 and was still with them in March 1932. [FIC/EF/5] Albert, a carpenter, was married to **Frances ROWLANDS** 27 February 1907 at Christ Church Cathedral, Stanley by C Rome Hall, BA, Assistant Chaplain. The witnesses were Franz F Lellman and F Rowlands. Frances' father was recorded as Francis Rowlands, master mariner. In 1913 Albert was awarded £66 by the FIC Ltd on account of an injury to his eye while at work. [FIC/D12; pg 529] Albert, a carpenter, died 13 July 1973 in Stanley. Frances died 22 November 1933, age 51, from coma and diabetes mellitus.
6. **Anna Emilie LELLMAN** born 18 January 1883 in Stanley. His father's occupation was recorded as carpenter. Anna was married to **Francis Ernest BURROWES**, electrical engineer 16 October 1912 at Christ Church Cathedral by Special Licence by Edward J Seymour, Dean & Chaplain. The witnesses were Victor Joseph Lellman, Orissa Lewis-Dean and Franz F Lellman. Francis' father was recorded as George Burrowes, deceased cabinet maker.
7. **Victor Joseph LELLMAN** born 1 August 1884. His father's occupation was recorded as carpenter. Victor, commercially employed, was married to **Isabella Frazer WATSON** 11 March 1914 at Christ Church Cathedral by Special Licence by C McDonald Hobleby, Assistant Chaplain. The witnesses were Mary Fleuret, Violet E Lellman, Franz F Lellman and D Russel Watson. Isabella's father was recorded as Thomas Watson, commercial. Victor entered Government Service in 1924 as a clerk. He was promoted to Chief Clerk

9 January 1937 and from 15 July 1938 to 1 September was head of his department. Victor, a civil servant, died 26 February 1941 from cerebral thrombosis and multiple thrombosis of veins. Isabella died 4 April 1942, age 55, from chronic inanition.

8. **Owen August LELLMAN** (twin) born 13 April 1889 in Stanley and baptised 1 June 1889 by Holy Trinity Church. His father's occupation was recorded as carpenter. Owen died 1 October 1890 from bronchitis and was buried 5 October 1890 in Grave D292.



9. **Violet Ellen LELLMAN** (twin) born 13 April 1889 in Stanley. Her father's occupation was recorded as carpenter. Violet departed 31 March 1908 on board the *Kenuta* bound for London with her sister Frederica and her husband and family.

SECOND GENERATION:

Children of Madeline (2) and Herbert HILL:

1. **Vernon Francis Rowland HILL** born 28 November 1897. His father's occupation was recorded as minister.

Children of Frederica (3) and William THOMPSON:

1. **Francis Eric Austin THOMPSON** born 16 July 1903 in Stanley. His father's occupation was recorded as colonial treasurer.
2. **William Humphrey Austin "Humphrey" THOMPSON** born 17 August 1904 at Stanley
3. **Wilfred Alex Austin THOMPSON** born 24 May 1906 at Stanley
4. **Geoffrey Falkland Austin THOMPSON** born 20 February 1908 in Stanley. His father's occupation was recorded as colonial treasurer.
5. **Phyllis Ellena Maria THOMPSON** born 5 December 1912 in Stanley. Her father's occupation was recorded as colonial treasurer.

Children of Francis (4) and Margaret LELLMAN:

1. **Edward Francis LELLMAN** born 19 October 1914 in Stanley. Edward, a civil servant, was married to **Winifred May BRIGGINSHAW**, state registered nurse, 19 October 1948 at the Nonconformist Church (Tabernacle), Stanley by Walter Forrest McWhan, Nonconformist Minister. The witnesses were J Bound and A R Draycott. Winifred's father was recorded as Horace Brigginsaw, agricultural worker. Winifred emigrated to the UK in 1948.

Children of Albert (5) and Frances LELLMAN:

1. **Francis Theodore LELLMAN** born 11 February 1908 in Stanley and baptised 29 March 1908 by Christ Church Cathedral. His father's occupation was recorded as carpenter. Francis was apprenticed by the Falkland Islands Company Ltd in their carpentry department for six years and finished his indentures 31 December 1932. Owing to the depression at the time he wasn't offered a permanent position. [FIC/EF/4] Francis, a schoolteacher, was married to **Mildred Gladys BRAXTON**, clerk, 26 March 1946 at Christ Church Cathedral by R G R Calvert, Chaplain. The witnesses were Winifred Joyce McLeod and Henry William Alfred Stewart. Mildred's father was recorded as Thomas Braxton, mason. Mildred died 29 August 1949, age 26, from pulmonary tuberculosis and was buried 31 August 1949 in Grave C1406. Francis died overseas and his ashes were buried 13 April 1991 in Grave 1809.
2. **Karl Vernon LELLMAN** born 25 January 1910. His father's occupation was recorded as carpenter. Karl, a clerk, was married to **Mary Malvina REIVE**, clerk, at the Nonconformist Church (Tabernacle), Stanley by Banns by Walter Forrest McWhan, Nonconformist Minister. The witnesses were H H Sedgwick and P M Atkins. Mary's

father was recorded as Thomas Reive, butcher. Karl and Mary emigrated to New Zealand via the UK in 1953.

3. **Nancy Sybill Francis LELLMAN** born 5 April 1915 I Stanley. Her father's occupation was recorded as carpenter. Nancy, a clerk, was married to **David Masterton HONEYMAN**, schoolmaster, 27 March 1937 at Christ Church Cathedral by Banns by Gerald K Lowe, Chaplain. The witnesses were Karl Lellman and Ellen Lellman. David's father was recorded as Andrew Honeyman, clerk.
4. **Boy LELLMAN** born 7 January 1922. Stillborn. His father's occupation was recorded as carpenter. *(No burial or grave record).*

Children of Albert (5) and Frances LELLMAN:

1. **Boy LELLMAN** born 13 February 1915. His father's occupation was recorded as merchant. Stillborn.
2. **Ellen Isabella LELLMAN** (twin) born 23 December 1918 in Stanley and baptised 11 March 1919 by Christ Church Cathedral. Her father's occupation was recorded as storekeeper. Ellen died 18 June 1941 from generalised tuberculosis and was buried 21 June 1941 in Grave L1186.
3. **Russell Thomas LELLMAN** (twin) born 23 December 1918 in Stanley. His father's occupation was recorded as storekeeper. Russell, a dental apprentice, went to the UK in 1939 to train in mechanical dentistry.
4. **Victor Kelvin LELLMAN** born [REDACTED]. His father's occupation was recorded as commercial. Victor, a civil servant, travelled to the UK in 1942 to join the Royal Air Force.
5. **Leonard Frazer LELLMAN** born [REDACTED] in Stanley. His father's occupation was recorded as clerk. Leonard, an apprentice, went to the UK in 1944 to join His Majesty's Forces.
