

McKINNON/MacKINNON/McKANNON FAMILY (1)

NB: The following is prepared from Falkland Islands Registers and files – there may be other family born outside the Falklands. Unless stated otherwise, all dated births, deaths and marriages occurred in the Falklands and all numbered graves are in Stanley Cemetery. Various spellings of names are recorded as written at the time.

Norman McKANNON, age 40, **Ann McKANNON**, age 38, and their children **Christina McKANNON**, age 16, **Alexander McKANNON**, age 14, and **Mary McKANNON**, age 12 departed London on board the *Matilda* at 2pm on 11 July 1867. [H25] Norman started working for the Falkland Islands Company Limited in the Lafonia areas in September 1867 on a monthly wage of £3-10-0. In October 1870 Norman and his family were living at Cantera House. By June 1873 he was earning £5-0-0 a month. [FIC Archives]

Children of Norman and Ann McKANNON:

1. **Christina McKINNON** was born 23 June 1846 at Fort William, Ben Nevis, Invernesshire, Scotland and came to the Falkland Islands with her family in 1867. [Penguin 24 Jun 1936] Christina, a minor and living at Cantera, was married to **Richard AITKEN**, shepherd living at Darwin, 11 July 1872 at Cantera, according to the Presbyterian form after banns by Rev. A Yeoman, Minister. The witnesses were Andrew Kyle and Mary Ann McKinnon. Richard's father was recorded as Francis Aitken, shepherd and Christina's as N McKinnon, shepherd. **Richard Alexander AITKEN** was born 25 September 1849 in Dunse, Dumfriesshire, Scotland. He entered into a five year contract with the Falkland Islands Company Ltd and left London June 1870 for Montevideo in the paddle steamer *La Plata* and then from Montevideo to the Falkland Islands in the schooner *Foam*, arriving 23 July 1870. By 14 October 1870 he was living at Cantera House. [FIC Despatches LO-St 1867-1877, pg 406; FIC sundry Letters 1868-1871, pg 648; Obituary Penguin 29 Jun 1934] Richard, a gardener, age 84, died 25 June 1934 and is buried in Grave K1065. Christina died 4 December 1940, age 95, and was buried 6 December 1940 in Grave K1173. [Obituary FI News Weekly 12 Dec 1940]
2. **Alexander McKINNON** born circa 1848 (*not in Falkland Islands*). Came to the Falkland Islands with his family in 1867. Alexander started working for the Falkland Islands Company Limited in the Lafonia area in December 1867 on a monthly wage of £2-0-0. He did not take any stores in his own name and his wages went to help with his father's debt. By June 1871 Alexander was earning £3-0-0 a month. [FIC Archives]
3. **Mary Ann McKINNON** born circa 1850 (*not in Falkland Islands*). Came to the Falkland Islands with her family in 1867. Mary was married to **Francis SIMPSON**, an English gaucho living at Darwin, 14 August 1872 at Darwin according to the Rites and Ceremonies of the Established Church, after banns, by A Yeoman Presbyterian Minister. The witnesses were Andrew Kyle and Maggie Fell. Francis' father was recorded as Thomas Simpson, shoemaker and pensioner, and Mary's father was recorded as Norman McKinnon, shepherd. Francis, age 89, died 16 November 1926 and was buried 18 November 1926 in Grave K950. Mary, age 78, died 25 November 1926 and was buried 28 November 1926 in Grave K954.

FIRST GENERATION:

Child of Christina McKINNON (1):

- a. **Neillie (Ellen) McKINNON** born 1 May 1869 and baptised 21 November 1869 by Holy Trinity Church. No father recorded on birth certificate. Ellen, age 19 and living in Stanley, was married to **Donald McCASKILL**, age 23 and a shepherd living in Stanley, 12 April 1888 in the Service room according to the Rites and Ceremonies of the Established Church by Licence by Lowther E Brandon MA Colonial Chaplain. The witnesses were Alexander Hunter and Jessie Cameron. Donald's father was recorded as Donald McCaskill, shepherd and Ellen's as William Johnson, shepherd.

Children of Christina (1) and Richard AITKEN:

1. **Jane AITKEN** born 24 August 1872 at Lion Creek. Her father's occupation was recorded as shepherd. Jane was married to **Edward RUSHEN** (*not in Falkland Islands*). Jane and her three children arrived from Punta Arenas on the *Sakkarah* 17 February 1899.
2. **Ann AITKEN** born 30 December 1873 at Lion Creek. Her father's occupation was recorded as shepherd. Ann, age 17 & living in Stanley, was married to **William Henry GOSS**, age 28, a cook living in Stanley and San Carlos, 24 August 1890 in the house of Mrs Goss according to the Rites and Ceremonies of the Established Church by Licence by Lowther E Brandon MA Colonial Chaplain. Ann signed with a X. The witnesses were R Aitken and Ann E Davis. William's father was recorded as Jacob Napoleon Goss, merchant. William died 23 September 1935, age 72, and is buried in Grave M1083. Ann died 23 August 1937 in Stanley and is buried in Grave M1114.
3. **William AITKEN** born 24 May 1875 on Speedwell Island. His father's occupation was recorded as shepherd. William, a publican's assistant, died 30 September 1891 from phthisis and is buried at Port San Carlos.
4. **Mary AITKEN** born 24 October 1877 on Speedwell Island. Her father's occupation was recorded as shepherd. Mary was married to **Albert Henry HILLS**, gardener, 20 August 1910 at the Registrar's Office, Stanley by G Hurst, Registrar General. The witnesses were Silvester Barnes and Hannah E A Aitken. Albert's father was recorded as David Hills, deceased foreman.
5. **Norman McKinnon AITKEN** born 11 October 1878 on Speedwell Island and baptised 13 February 1880 by Holy Trinity Church. His father's occupation was recorded as shepherd. Norman died 1 December 1914 from an accident (*drowned while crossing between Engineer Pt & the W/T Station*) while in the performance of his duty in the Volunteer Corps and is buried in Grave A777.
6. **Elizabeth Inglis AITKEN** born 25 October 1879 and baptised 13 February 1880 by Holy Trinity Church. Her father's occupation was recorded as shepherd. Elizabeth died 23 October 1888 at Darwin from tubercular phthisis and is buried in Grave A85.
7. **John "Jack" AITKEN** born 5 August 1881 on Speedwell Island. His father's occupation was recorded as shepherd. Jack died 9 May 1954 and is buried in Grave A1533.
8. **Richard Alexander AITKEN** born 12 May 1883 on Speedwell Island and baptised 13 August 1884 by Holy Trinity Church. His father's occupation was recorded as foreman. Richard died 7 April 1911 from phthisis and is buried in Grave H734.

9. **Robert Phorsen AITKEN** born 5 December 1884 and baptised 8 March 1885 in Stanley by the Tabernacle. His father's occupation was recorded as shepherd. Robert died 31 August 1893 from consumption of the bowels and is buried in Grave A84.
10. **James AITKEN** born 20 December 1885 in Stanley and baptised 13 February 1887 by the Tabernacle. His father's occupation was recorded as labourer.
11. **Jannet Harriet AITKEN** born 30 November 1887 and baptised 4 November 1888 by the Tabernacle. Her father's occupation was recorded as labourer. Jannet was married to **William Mendoza PARRIN**, shepherd, 30 March 1905 in the house of Henry Parrin, Stanley by Lowther E Brandon MA Dean & Colonial Chaplain. The witnesses were George Parrin and John Aitken. William's father was recorded as Henry Parrin, waiter. William, a labourer age 64, died 30 April 1945 and is buried in Grave O1136. Jannet died 13 August 1952 from pulmonary tuberculosis and is buried in Grave 1490.
12. **Elizabeth Inglis AITKEN** born 3 September 1889 in Stanley and baptised 17 November 1889 by the Tabernacle. Her father's occupation was recorded as labourer. Elizabeth was married to **Silvester BARNES**, labourer, 12 July 1910 in Christ Church Cathedral by Edward J Seymour, Chaplain & Hon Canon. The witnesses were Richard Aitken, Hannah Elizabeth Agnes Aitken and Alexander McIntosh Barnes. Silvester's father was recorded as Arthur James Barnes, shepherd. Elizabeth died 3 July 1939, age 49, of pulmonary tuberculosis and is buried in Grave K1135. Silvester died 19 May 1961 at Stanley and is buried in Grave Q1696.
13. **Hannah Elizabeth Agnes AITKEN** born 2 September 1893 in Stanley and baptised 22 October 1893 by Holy Trinity Church. Her father's occupation was recorded as blacksmith. Hannah was married to **William Brown VERRILL**, mariner, 17 July 1916 at Christ Church Cathedral by Special Licence by J Stanley Smith, Clerk in Holy Orders. The witnesses were A A Felton and Harriet McAskill. William's father was recorded as John William Verrill, mariner.

Children of Mary (3) and Francis SIMPSON:

1. **Hannah SIMPSON** born 5 August 1874 at Port Purvis, West Falkland. Her father's occupation was recorded as herdsman. Hannah, age 16 and living at Shag Cove, Port Howard, was married to **Alfred Vincent LEE**, age 26 and a shepherd living at Green Hill, Port Howard, 8 September 1890 in the house of Francis Simpson, Shag Cove, Port Howard according to the Rites and Ceremonies of the Established Church by Licence by Lowther E Brandon MA Colonial Chaplain. The witnesses were Francis Simpson and Jacob John Lee. Alfred's father was recorded as Jacob Lee, shepherd, and Hannah's father was recorded as Francis Simpson, shepherd.
2. **Thomas Francis "Tim" SIMPSON** born 23 March 1876 at Shag Harbour, West Falkland. His father's occupation was recorded as herdsman. Thomas, age 69, died 6 May 1945 at Port Howard from burns from an accidental fire and was buried at Port Howard.
3. **Mary Ann SIMPSON** born 9 February 1878 at Shag Cove, West Falkland and baptised 6 June 1878 by Holy Trinity Church. Her father's occupation was recorded as herdsman. Mary, age 17 and living at White Rock, Port Howard, was married to **Alexander McLEOD**, age 27 and a shepherd living at White Rock, Port Howard, 5 July 1894 at Shag Cove Port Howard according to the Rites and Ceremonies of the Established Church by Licence by Lowther E Brandon MA Dean & Colonial Chaplain. The witnesses were Henry Gilbert and

Thomas Simpson. Alexander's father was recorded as Donald McLeod, joiner, and Mary's father was recorded as Francis Simpson, shepherd. Alexander died 19 May 1933. Mary Ann, the widow of Alexander, shepherd boss, died 29 August 1951.

4. **George Henry SIMPSON** born 4 January 1880 at Shag Cove, West Falkland and baptised 6 February 1880 by Holy Trinity Church. His father's occupation was recorded as herdsman. George, age 79 and a retired shepherd, died 2 September 1959 in Stanley and was buried 5 September 1959 in Grave S1645.
5. **Catherine Marion SIMPSON** born 25 August 1881 at Hill Gap and baptised 9 June 1882 by Holy Trinity Church. Her father's occupation was recorded as herdsman. Catherine, living in Stanley, was married to **Frederick George LEE**, shepherd at Mount Rosalie, Port Howard, 18 July 1906 at Christ Church Cathedral, Stanley by Special Licence No 79 by Lowther E Brandon MA Dean & Colonial Chaplain. The witnesses were Francis Simpson and George Henry Simpson. Frederick's father was recorded as Jacob Lee, shepherd, and Catherine's father was recorded as Francis Simpson, shepherd. Catherine died 18 February 1959 in Stanley, age 77, and was buried 21 February 1959 in Grave S1774. Frederick, age 95 and a retired shepherd, died 22 October 1967 in Stanley and was buried 26 October 1967 in Grave S1774.
6. **Harriet Christina SIMPSON** born 22 March 1883 and baptised 8 March 1884 by Holy Trinity Church. Her father's occupation was recorded as herdsman. Harriet was married to **Alfred Edward DEARLING**, cook, 2 June 1919 at Christ Church Cathedral by Banns by J Stanley Smith, Clerk in Holy Orders. The witnesses were Alexander McLeod, Mary McLeod and Francis Simpson. Alfred's father was recorded as Henry James Dearling, deceased printer, and Harriet's father was recorded as Francis Simpson, gardener. Harriet, age 68, died 25 June 1951 and was buried in Grave 1456. Alfred, age 78 and a gardener from England, died 9 November 1953 and was buried 11 November 1953 in Grave 1523.
7. **Alexander Spong SIMPSON** born 5 December 1884 and baptised 25 May 1885 by Holy Trinity Church. His father's occupation was recorded as gaucho. Alexander, age 86 and a gardener, died 25 March 1971 in Stanley and was buried 27 March 1971 in Grave T2160.
8. **Francis SIMPSON** born 17 August 1886 and baptised **Richard Francis SIMPSON** 12 May 1887 by Holy Trinity Church. His father's occupation was recorded as gaucho. Francis, age 19 yrs & 10mths and a labourer at Port Howard, died from tubercular peritonitis and was buried 16 June 1906 in Grave F481.

SECOND GENERATION:

Children of Neillie/Ellen (1) (a) and Donald McCASKILL:

1. **Christina Catherine McASKILL** born 9 April 1889. Christina was married to (1) **Frederick Arthur GLEADELL**, shepherd, 6 July 1908 in Christ Church Cathedral by C F Mermagen, MA, PhD, Hon Canon Cathedral Chaplain. The witnesses were William Westerling and Sybella Ellen McAskill. Frederick's father was recorded as Edwin Gleadell, labourer. Christina, a divorcee was married to (2) **Henry John BONNER**, labourer, 14 August 1925 at the Registrar's Office, Stanley by Special Licence by M Craigie-Halkett, Registrar General. The witnesses were V Atkins and A O Sullivan. Henry's father was recorded as William Bonner, carter. Henry went to Montevideo on medical in 1962. He died prior to 1968 (*not in Falkland Islands*). Christina died 8 March 1968, age 78, at Stanley and is buried in Grave T2098.
2. **Sybella Ellen McASKILL** born 28 May 1890. Sybella was married to **William David Noah BETTS**, shepherd, 30 March 1910 at Pebble Island by Special Licence by J Meredith Bate, Assistant Cathedral Chaplain. The witnesses were Ella Esther Elizabeth Betts and Charles Edward Kelway. William's father was recorded as John Cranmer Betts, manager. Sybella died 26 June 1967 at Stanley and is buried in Grave T2075. William died 20 October 1967 at Stanley and is buried in Grave T2076.
3. **Edith Ann "Edie" McASKILL** born 9 September 1893 (twin) at Roy Cove. Edie and Harriet were bridesmaids for the wedding of Edith Betts and John Lyse on Pebble Island 25 May 1902. Edith was married to **John Falkland BIGGS**, general labourer, 10 July 1911 at Christ Church Cathedral by Special Licence by Edward J Seymour, Dean & Chaplain. The witnesses were Christina Goss and John Alazia. John's father was recorded as Edward Biggs, deceased gardener. John died 16 October 1967 at Stanley and is buried in Grave L1772. Edith died 26 July 1974 at Stanley and is buried in Grave L1832.
4. **Harriet Mary McASKILL** born 9 September 1893 (twin) at Roy Cove. Edie and Harriet were bridesmaids for the wedding of Edith Betts and John Lyse on Pebble Island 25 May 1902. Harriet was married to **Arthur Alfred FELTON**, mariner, 24 July 1916 at Christ Church Cathedral by Banns by J Stanley Smith, Clerk in Holy Orders. The witnesses were William Brown Verrill and H E A Verrill. Arthur, a sheep farm manager, died 21 February 1953 and is buried in Grave 1503. Harriet, a domestic, went to the UK and Channel Islands in 1970 to visit relatives and settle.
5. **Donald William McASKILL** born 30 July 1895. Donald, a shepherd, was married to **Susan Blanche JOHNSON** 22 April 1929 at Port Howard, West Falklands by Special Licence by S E E Aylward, Clerk in Holy Orders. The witnesses were George Fredrick Johnson and Beatrice Mary Malvina Johnson. Susan's father was recorded as Fredrick George Johnson, foreman. Donald died 19 April 1976 at Stanley and is buried in Grave T2130. Susan died 30 July 1992 and is buried in Grave T2131.
6. **Roderick John McASKILL** born 5 November 1898 at Pebble Island.

Children of Jane (1) (1) and Edward RUSHEN:

1. **Edward RUSHEN** born 17 June 1892 and baptised 8 November 1896. The sponsors were Jason Stout, Elizabeth Burton and Margaret Burton. The family were living at Guerr-aikie,

Rio Gallegos, Patagonia at the time of the baptism and his father's occupation was recorded as shepherd.

2. **Ellen RUSHEN** born 21 April 1895 and baptised 8 November 1896. The sponsors were Jam Rushen, Mary Stout and Jason Stout. The family were living at Guerr-aikie, Rio Gallegos, Patagonia at the time of the baptism and her father's occupation was recorded as shepherd.
3. **Alfred RUSHEN** born 24 August 1897 and baptised 27 November 1898. The family were living at Guerr-aikie, Rio Gallegos, Patagonia at the time of the baptism and his father's occupation was recorded as shepherd.

Children of Ann (1) (2) and William GOSS:

1. **Christina GOSS** born 10 August 1892 at San Carlos. Her father's occupation was recorded as cook. Christina was married to **Christoph Peter BENDER**, farmer 25 October 1916 at St Mary's Roman Catholic Chapel, Stanley by Banns by Mario Louis Migone. The witnesses were William Aldridge and Edith Norton. Christoph's father was recorded as Christoph Bender, farmer. Christoph and Christina emigrated to the UK in 1953.
2. **Lilian GOSS** born 13 May 1894. Her father's occupation was recorded as labourer. Died 30 December 1902 from euteric fever and is buried in Grave D327.
3. **Maud GOSS** born 3 December 1896. Her father's occupation was recorded as cook. Died 11 January 1897 from inanition and is buried in Grave A90.
4. **Hector Augustus GOSS** born 2 August 1898 in Stanley. His father's occupation was recorded as cook. Hector, a shepherd, went on holiday to Punta Arenas in 1927.
5. **Jacob Napoleon GOSS** born 2 January 1901. His father's occupation was recorded as cook. Jacob, a shepherd, died 20 August 1955 on New Island and is buried in Grave Q1599.
6. **(Lilian) Emily Jane GOSS** born 12 February 1903. Her father's occupation was recorded as labourer. Emily was married to (1) **Thomas BINNIE**, lighthouse keeper, 22 July 1924 at Christ Church Cathedral by J Stanley Smith, Clerk in Holy Orders. The witnesses were J Walsh Jnr and A C Kiddle. Thomas' father was recorded as James George Binnie, mason. Thomas was presumed drowned at Volunteer Lagoon while proceeding by pram from the schooner "Peronelle" on 22 October 1933. (see *Penguin 4 & 23 Nov 1933*). Body not found. Emily, a widow, was married to (2) **Marklin Lawrence GLEADELL**, (see (a) (1) (3)) labourer, 5 November 1935 at the Registrar's Office, Stanley by Registrar General's Licence by A R Hoare, Ag Registrar General. The witnesses were Raymond Steve Courtnay and Elizabeth Agnes Barnes. Divorced. Emily went to the UK in 1947 to enter a lunatic asylum.
7. **Ann Elizabeth GOSS** born 11 June 1904 at Goose Green. Her father's occupation was recorded as cook. Ann died 26 November 1904 at Darwin from suffocation (*buried there?*).
8. **Elizabeth Agnes GOSS** born 26 October 1905 at Goose Green. Her father's occupation was recorded as cook. Elizabeth was married to **William Ernest SPENCER**, assistant light keeper, 26 April 1930 at Christ Church Cathedral by Special Licence by F S Vaughan, Clerk in Holy Orders. The witnesses were William R Hills and Ruth Davis. William's father was recorded as Ernest Henry Spencer, policeman. William died 24 November 1981 in Stanley (*no burial record*).

9. **Sarah GOSS** born 20 June 1908 at Goose Green. Her father's occupation was recorded as cook. Sarah was married to **James Albert "Jim" "Pudding" ANDERSON**, labourer, 5 June 1928 at the Registrar's Office, Stanley by Special Licence by M Craigie Halkett, Registrar General. The witnesses were E A Goss and W R Halliday. James' father was recorded as William Anderson, shepherd. Sarah died 26 April 1932 from puerperal septicaemia and is buried in Grave K1032. James was in the Falkland Islands Defence Force for many years. James drowned 24 December 1942 and is buried in Grave O1232.
10. **William Henry GOSS** born 27 February 1911 in Stanley. His father's occupation was recorded as cook. William, a mariner, was married to **Grace Elizabeth MILLER** 18 July 1936 at St Mary's Catholic Church, Stanley by Banns by Hugh Drum, RC Priest. The witnesses were William Ernest Spencer and Heather Margaret Miller. Grace's father was recorded as John Miller, labourer. Grace died, age 88, 24 May 2001 and is buried in Grave V3332. William died 30 October 2002 in Stanley.
11. **Phillis Ileen GOSS** born 10 August 1914. Her father's occupation was recorded as cook. Phillis was married to (1) **Silvester Manfred RUTTER**, labourer 3 October 1934 at the Registrar's Office, Stanley by Special Licence by A R Hoare, Ag Registrar General. The witnesses were W R Hills and Richard Barnes. Silvester's father was not recorded. Silvester, captain of the mv *Penelope*, died accidentally by strangulation and "by Act of God" at Foam Creek, Rincon Grande and is buried in Grave M1516. Phillis was married to (2) **James George ROWLANDS**, widower and labourer, 2 June 1956 at the Office of the Registrar General, Stanley by Harold Bennett, Registrar General. The witnesses were W R Rowlands, John Lang, Sylva Spencer and Genevieve Rutter. James' father was recorded as George Rowlands, deceased carpenter. James died 2 July 1963 in Stanley, age 54, and is buried in Grave Q1741. Phillis emigrated to New Zealand in 1964.
12. **Dorothy Maud GOSS** born 9 August 1918 at Salvador. Her father's occupation was recorded as cook. Dorothy was married to (1) **John Stanley LANG**, labourer, 13 October 1951 at the Registrar's Office, Stanley by Special Licence by Malcolm J Stewart, Registrar General. The witnesses were William Henry Stewart and Mrs S M Rutter. John's father was recorded as Frank Lang, deceased cook. Dorothy, a divorced dairy assistant, was married to (2) **Charles Desmond Keenleyside**, carpenter from England, 25 March 1953 at the Office of the Registrar General, Stanley by Arthur Rutter, Acting Registrar. The witnesses were James Blyth and Christina Bender. Charles' father was recorded as Thomas William Keenleyside, master hairdresser.

Children of Mary (1) (4) AITKEN:

- a. **William Phorsen AITKEN** born 11 August 1909 in Stanley. Father not recorded. **William HILLS**, a seaman, was married to **Mary Elizabeth STEWART** 30 April 1938 at Christ Church Cathedral by Gerald K Lowe, Senior Chaplain. The witnesses were A H Hills and E M Hills. William, a cook on the *Monsunen*, went to the UK in 1980.
- b. **May McKinnon AITKEN** born 24 August 1907 in Punta Arenas, Chile. Father not recorded. **May AITKEN** was married to **William Nathaniel "Buttons" BINNIE**, labourer 1 June 1927 at Christ Church Cathedral by Special Licence by Fredk S Vaughan, Clerk in Holy Orders. The witnesses were L A Sedgwick and E A Goss. William's father was recorded as James George Binnie, Mason. William died 6 January 1961 and is buried in Grave S 1687. May went to the UK in 1979.

Children of Mary (1) (4) and Albert HILLS:

1. **Dorothy Caroline Christina HILLS** born 11 March 1911 in Stanley. Housemaid. Went on holiday to the UK in 1936.
2. **George Norman HILLS** born 6 October 1912 in Stanley. George, a labourer, died 20 January 1940 from a pulmonary embolism and tuberculosis pleurisy and is buried in Grave L1156.
3. **Emily Mary HILLS** born 31 October 1914 on George Island. Emily went to Uruguay on medical in 1944.
4. **Albert Richard HILLS** born 1 September 1916.
5. **Richard William HILLS** born 1 November 1918. Richard, a haulage contractor, was married to **Heather Margaret MILLER**, clerk, 20 September 1941 at Christ Church Cathedral by Gerald K Lowe, Senior Chaplain. The witnesses were Helen Lees and A H Hills. Heather's father was recorded as John Miller, cobbler. Heather died 11 September 2004, age 84, and was buried 15 September 2004 in Grave W3395. Richard, age 90, died in Stanley 7 May 2009 and was buried 15 May 2009 in Grave W3396.
6. **James Stanley HILLS** born 24 December 1921. James, a labourer, went to Montevideo on medical in 1943.

Children of Jannet (1) (11) and William PARRIN:

1. **William Richard Bird PARRIN** born 24 March 1907 at Teal Inlet.
