NIXON FAMILY

NB: The following is prepared from Falkland Islands Registers and files – there may be other family born outside the Falklands. Unless stated otherwise, all dated births, deaths and marriages occurred in the Falklands and all numbered graves are in Stanley Cemetery. Various spellings of names are recorded as written at the time.

According to his military discharge dated 31 May 1864 **John NIXON** was born at Berlington, Bridlington, Yorkshire, England.

John and **Anne** "**Annie**" (née **O'CONNELL**) **NIXON** and their children **Jane, Catherine** and **John NIXON** arrived in the Falkland Islands on board the British Barque *Ealing Grove* 12 January 1858 as part of the Falkland Islands Company detachment of Pensioners. John was a private of the 55th Regiment. [H14, pg 316] John worked as the Government Printer from 1874-1883 (*may have for more than this – need copies of Blue Books*)

Ann died in Stanley 24 July 1887, age 65, and was buried 28 July 1887 (no Grave number recorded). She was recorded as a native of Ireland. John died in January 1888 from dropsy and was buried 24 January 1888 (no Grave number recorded).

FIRST GENERATION:

Children of John and Ann NIXON:

- 1. Jane NIXON born circa 1850 (not in Falklands). When age 18 and working as a domestic in Stanley married (1) William Andrew "Andrew" RYAN, age 31 and a mariner from County Marindo, Carlow, Ireland, 23 July 1868 at Trinity Church Stanley according to the Rites and Ceremonies of the Church of England by Charles Bull MA Colonial Chaplain. The witnesses were Catherine Hellier and Henry Pain. William's father was recorded as Patrick Ryan, carpenter, and Jane's as John Nixon, soldier. William, a shepherd at the time, died 26 October 1885, age 48, of tubercular phthisis (no Grave number recorded). Jane married (2) James Henry LEWIS, mariner living in Stanley, 4 June 1896 in the House of Mrs Ryan Stanley according to the Rites & Ceremonies of the Established Church by Licence by Edwin Coupland Aspinall Canon of Christ Church Colonial Chaplain. The witnesses were Arthur Hardy and Emily Hocking. James' father was recorded as Henry Lewis, mariner and Jane's as John Nixon, printer and pensioner 55 Regiment. James died 29 March 1903, age 56, of Brights disease of kidneys, and is buried in Grave 1652. The informant was J Ryan of Stanley. Jane died 24 March 1907, age 56, of chronic myocarditis, and is buried in Grave A27. The informant was Clara Brown of Stanley.
- 2. Catherine "Kate" NIXON born circa 1852 (not in Falklands). Died 22 October 1867, age 15, at night at Mr Griffith's house (the court house) in Stanley from the effects of a burn and was buried 27 October 1867 (no Grave number recorded). [D13, pg 67]
- 3. **John NIXON** born May 1856 (not in Falklands). Died 13 June 1872, age 16 years and 1 month, at San Carlos from pneumonia and was buried 16 June 1872 at San Carlos.
- 4. Ann "Annie" NIXON born 31 January 1859 in Stanley and baptised 2 June 1859 by Holy Trinity Church. In 1872 Charles SUPPLE was charged by John Nixon with "carnally knowing his daughter Anne Nixon while at Port Stephens, the girl being only thirteen years and eight months". Charles Supple pleaded guilty 5 September 1872. [H30; pg230: D 15] Annie was married to Reuben COATES, private Royal Marines Light Infantry, 20 December 1876 St Mary's Catholic Church Stanley by James Foran Catholic Priest. On the 21 December 1876 a marriage service was performed in Trinity Church Stanley according to

the Rites and Ceremonies of the Established Church (after marriage by banns in the RC Chapel Dec 20 1876) by Waits H Falkland Islands James Foran. The witnesses for both weddings were John Nixon and Lizzie Nixon. Reuben's father was recorded as Richard Coates, labourer and Annie's as John Nixon, pensioner. Annie, Reuben and their son Richard sailed to Devonport, Plymouth, which was Reuben's base, sometime after 6 January 1878. Reuben later died of TB and Annie remarried sometime after.

5. Elizabeth Emma "Lizzie" NIXON born 11 May 1861 in Stanley and baptised 7 July 1861 by Holy Trinity Church. Married William John "John" CHEEK, mason, 20 June 1877 in Holy Trinity Church according to the Rites and Ceremonies of the Established Church after Banns by Lowther E Brandon Colonial Chaplain. The witnesses were John Nixon and Annie Coates. William's father was recorded as Cecil James Cheek, Mason and Lizzie's as John Nixon, pensioner. John was born 1 December 1846 in Hatfield, Hertfordshire. Lizzie died 26 July 1883 at Fox Bay and is supposed to be buried in the garden at the big house there. John left for Liverpool 30 July 1907 on RMS Orepesa. He died 10 March 1931 in England.

SECOND GENERATION:

Children of Jane (1) and William RYAN:

- 1. **Edith Ellen RYAN** born 13 September 1869 in Stanley. Her father was working as a seaman at the time. Died 15 September 1869 in Stanley from convulsions (*no grave number recorded*).
- 2. **Emma Jane RYAN** born 2 October 1870. Her father was working as a seaman at the time. Married **Thomas BURNS**, age 27 and a horsebreaker living in Stanley, 19 August 1886 in the house of Mrs Ryan according to the Rites and Ceremonies of the Established Church by Licence by Lowther E Brandon MA Colonial Chaplain. The witnesses were William Moon and William Stephen Elmer. Thomas' father was recorded as Thomas Burns, painter. Thomas died 4 May 1936 in Stanley and is buried in Grave K1093. [Obituary Penguin 9 May 1936, pg 3] Emma died 22 April 1946 and is buried in Grave K1321.



3. Mary Ann RYAN born 14 February 1873. Her father was working as a shepherd at the time. Married Frank John LANG, age 28, 13 July 1892 in the Baptist Tabernacle. Mary, age 44, died 5 April 1916 from childbirth, bronchitis & heart failure, and was buried 9 April 1916 in Grave A806. John, age 55 and a British mariner, died 8 August 1916 in Stanley from cirrhosis of the liver, jaundice & heart failure, and was buried 11 August 1916 in Grave A810.

Death of Mrs. John Lang.

It is with deep regret that we have to record the death of Mrs. Lang of Stanley. Some time previously Mrs. Lang has undergone an operation of a serious nature. From this she appeared to be recovering, and hopes were entertained for her restoration to health. Unfortunately, however, comflications set in with the result that she passed to her rest late on Wednesday evening, the 5th. of April. The funeral took place on the following Sunday afternoon. Mr. Lang and his family can rest assured of the deepest sympathy of all their friends in the Falklands. Mrs. Lang died at the age of 44 years.

- 4. Isabella RYAN born 23 July 1875 at Port Stephens. Her father was working as a shepherd at the time. Married Harold Hubert HAYES, age 22 and mate of Fortuna 10 April 1900 in the Parish Church according to the Rites & Ceremonies of the Established Church after Banns by me Lowther E Brandon. The witnesses were Catherine Ryan and Annie Ryan. Harold's father was recorded as Hubert Henry Hayes, farmer.
- 5. Catherine RYAN born 19 December 1877 at Teal Inlet. Her father was working as a shepherd at the time and known as Andrew. Married Carl Wilhelm ENGLUND, age 25 and

a mariner of Stanley & Gotheburg, Sweden 18 April 1901 in the house of James Lewis according to the Rites & Ceremonies of the Established Church by Licence by Lowther E Brandon MA Dean & Colonial Chaplain. The witnesses were James Lewis and Annie Ryan. Carl's father was recorded as Herman Englund, tanner.

- 6. James Andrew John RYAN born 14 June 1880 at Teal Inlet. Foreman navvy. Married Ann MYLES 1 August 1912 at Darwin Harbour by Special Licence by Edward J Seymour, Dean & Chaplain. The witnesses were Mary Myles and John Stanley Ryan. Mary's father was recorded as Thomas Myles, mariner. James died 15 December 1929 at Darwin from heart failure and is buried there.
- 7. **Anne Weddell RYAN** born 14 December 1882 in Stanley. Married **Elemuel Enos WILLIAMS**, sealer, 25 February 1907 at the house of Mrs James Lewis, Stanley by C R Hall, BA, Assistant Chaplain. The witnesses were Mary Ellen Poppy and Clarissa Sarah Brown. Elemuel's father was recorded as John Edward Williams, fisherman.
- 8. John Stanley RYAN born 15 June 1885. His father was working as a shepherd at the time. Mechanic. Married (1) Mary MYLES 29 June 1917 at the Church, Darwin by Banns by C McDonald Hobley, Clerk in Holy Orders. The witnesses were Thomas Myles, Arthur Earle and Margaret A Morrison. Mary's father was recorded as Thomas Myles, mariner. Mary died 18 October 1926 from tuberculosis and is buried in Grave J948. John married (2) Anne RYAN, widow (sister of Mary & widow of James), 31 July 1935 at the Registrar's Office, Stanley by Registrar General's Licence by A R Hoare, Ag Registrar General. The witnesses were Victor Lellman and Margaret Smith. Anne's father was recorded as Thomas Myles, sailor. John died 11 June 1968 in Stanley. Ann died 14 October 1972 in Stanley.



Children of Annie (4) and Reuben COATES:

1. **Richard John COATES** born 28 November 1877 in Stanley. His father was recorded as a private in the Royal Marines Light Infantry. Baptised 6 January 1878 by Holy Trinity Church. Left sometime after this with his parents for Devonport, Plymouth.

Children of Lizzie (5) and John CHEEK:

1. Clara Louisa CHEEK born 29 April 1879 at Fox Bay. Her father's occupation was recorded as labourer. Married Charles BETTS, age 28 and a gardener at Hill Cove, 9 January 1902 at Hill Cove according to the Rites & Ceremonies of the Established Church by Lowther E Brandon MA Dean & Colonial Chaplain. The witnesses were Frederick Cheek and Emily Jane Goss Paice. Charles' father was recorded as John Betts, carter. Charles died 26 May

1953 and is buried in Grave 1512. Clara died 11 August 1969 and is buried in Grave Q1787.



2. Frederick CHEEK born 20 October 1880 at Fox Bay. His father's occupation was recorded as mason. Shepherd. Married Minnie TULLETT, from Brighton, England, 10 November 1906 at The Point, Hill Cove, West Falklands by Lowther E Brandon MA Dean. The witnesses were Fred G Langdon and Charles Betts. Minnie's father was recorded as John Tullett, engine driver. Minnie came out as a governess to the Miller children; arriving 1 October 1903 on board the Orita from Liverpool. Frederick, age 37 and a shepherd, died 22 December 1917 at Teal River, Hill Cove from tuberculosis. Minnie, age 66, died 21 February 1945 from leukaemia and was buried in Grave O 1295.

OBITUARY.

News of the death of Mr. Fred Cheek on 22nd December at Teal River was received with deep regret not only in Stanley but especially on the West Falklands, where the greater part of his life was spent and where he was universally liked.

In many respects Mr. Cheek was a remarkable man. At the age of eight, owing to an accident, he lost an arm. Yet in spite of this handicap Mr. Cheek learnt to perform all the duties of a shepherd with great efficiency. It was suprising to see how skillfully he could cut peat, wheel a barrow, and carry a baby on horseback. For many years Mr. Cheek worked on the Hill Cove Station, where his stirling worth and loyalty were highly appreciated by the Manager.

In his last illness Mr. Cheek displayed an admirable cheerfulness of spirit. He was grateful for the many acts of kindness bestowed by numerous friends, but of his own suffering he had little or nothing to say. He was only concerned lest his relatives should worry.

Mr. Cheek, who was only 36 years of age, leaves a widow and three children. To them and to his sisters, Mrs. Charles Betts and Mrs. Henry Newing, we offer our deepest sympathy.



3. Elizabeth Emma CHEEK born 8 January 1883 at Fox Bay. Her father's occupation was recorded as carpenter. Domestic. Married Henry Newing, age 25 and an engine driver, 8 May 1902 in the Cathedral Church of Christ Stanley according to the Rites & Ceremonies of the Established Church after Banns by N Blount MA Assistant Colonial Chaplain. The witnesses were James Ryan and Annie Maud Newing. Henry's father was recorded as Lawrence Newing, blacksmith. Henry died 5 November 1935 in Stanley from cerebral thrombosis after and operation on the 1 November 1935 and was buried 8 November 1935 in Grave K1085. Elizabeth died 25 July 1971 in Stanley, age 88, and was buried 29 July 1971 in Grave U2167.

THIRD GENERATION:

Children of Emma (1) (2) and Thomas BURNS:

- 1. Jane BURNS born 7 November 1888 at Congo House, Lafonia. Her father was working as a shepherd at the time. Married Alfred Harry DUFFIN, foreman labourer from England, 21 August 1914 at North Arm by Alex Moir, Deputy Registrar. The witnesses were Henry Jennings and Emma Burns. Alfred's father was recorded as Thomas Duffin, labourer. Jane died 7 March 1949 and is buried in Grave Q1397. Alfred died 14 June 1955, age 70, and is buried in Grave Q1548.
- William BURNS born 8 March 1890 at Congo House, Wharton Harbour, Lafonia. His father
 was working as a shepherd at the time. William died 15 October 1966 in Stanley and is
 buried in Grave T2065.
- 3. **Frederick John BURNS** born 5 September 1893 at Wharton Harbour, Lafonia. His father was working as a shepherd at the time. Died 15 December 1896, age 3 years and 3 months, from croup and is buried in Grave A687.
- 4. Elizabeth Catherine BURNS born 16 May 1895 at Wharton Harbour, Lafonia. Her father was working as a shepherd at the time. Died 27 October 1895, age 5 months, from meningitis and is buried at North Arm. The informant was David Bond, friend, shepherd, North Arm.
- 5. **Thomas N BURNS** born circa February 1896. Died 28 August 1896, age 6 months, and is buried at Congo House, North Arm (*no birth or death entry in registers*).

Children of Mary Ann (1) (3) and Frank LANG:

- 1. Elizabeth Jane LANG born 30 May 1893 in Stanley and baptised 28 November 1893 by Christ Church Cathedral. Her father's occupation was recorded as sailor. Elizabeth was married to James Henry STEWART, shepherd, 21 April 1910 at Stanley by Robert Johnson, Nonconformist Minister. The witnesses were Frank Lang and Emily Anderson. James' father was recorded as David Stewart, deceased, and Elizabeth's father was recorded as Frank Lang, seaman. James, age 82 and a retired shepherd, died 4 June 1957 in Stanley and was buried 7 June 1957 in Grave P1587. Elizabeth, age 79 and a widow, died 27 May 1972 in KEMH, Stanley and was buried 30 May 1972 in Grave U2187.
- Frank LANG born 17 February 1895 and baptised 17 May 1897 by Christ Church Cathedral. His father's occupation was recorded as labourer. Frank was working on Pebble Island from December 1932 to April 1933 and from October 1935 to April 1937. Frank, age 67 and a cook, died 2 May 1962 in Stanley and was buried 5 May 1962 in Grave S1717.
- 3. William Andrew LANG born 20 January 1897 in Stanley and baptised 17 May 1897 by Christ Church Cathedral. His father's occupation was recorded as labourer. William, a shepherd, was married to Dorothy Mary Eleanor JONES 20 July 1929 at Christ Church Cathedral by Special Licence by S E E Aylward, Clerk in Holy Orders. The witnesses were Gwendoline Maud Lafone Jones and John Stanley Lang. Dorothy's father was recorded as John William Jones, seaman and William's father was recorded as Frank Lang cook. William, age 73 and retired, went to Buenos Aires in March 1972 for medical treatment. Dorothy, age 76 and a widow, died 28 June 1977 in Stanley and was buried 1 July 1977 in Grave U1892.

- 4. Catherine Honey LANG born 3 May 1901 and baptised Kathleen Annie LANG 3 November 1901 by Christ Church Cathedral. Her father's occupation was recorded as cook. Kathleen was married to Albert Hugh JONES, cook, 5 April 1921 at Weddell Island, West Falkland by J Stanley Smith, Clerk in Holy Orders. The witnesses were J F C Jones and Mabel G Jones. Albert's father was recorded as John William Jones, mariner, and Kathleen's father was recorded as Frank Lang, deceased cook. Albert, a farm foreman, died 12 December 1968 in Stanley and was buried 14 December 1968 in Grave T2133. Kathleen died 25 September 1969, age 68, and was buried 29 September 1969 in Grave T2134.
- 5. Isabella "Bella" LANG born 13 March 1903 in Stanley and baptised at Douglas Station 31 March 1903 by Christ Church Cathedral. Isabella was married to Dominic William O'SULLIVAN, clerk, 1 August 1929 at St Mary's Roman Catholic Chapel, Stanley by Special Licence by Mario Louis Migone, Priest in Charge. The witnesses were Fred Henricksen and Laura O'Sullivan. Dominic's father was recorded as Daniel John O'Sullivan, chief constable, and Isabella's father was recorded as Frank Lang, deceased. Dominic, age 46 and a police officer, and Isabella, age 47, went to the UK in 1951 on leave.
- 6. **John Stanley LANG** born 17 May 1905 in Stanley and baptised 23 June 1905 by Christ Church Cathedral. His father's occupation was recorded as mariner. John, a labourer, was married to **Dorothy Maud GOSS** 28 May 1936 at the Registrar's Office, Stanley by Special Licence by Malcolm J Stewart, Registrar General. The witnesses were William Henry Stewart and Mrs S M Rutter. John's father was recorded as Frank Lang, deceased cook, and Dorothy's father was recorded as William Henry Goss, deceased cook. John departed for South Georgia 30 October 1936 on board the *Fitzroy*. John, who had been working with the whalers, returned 23 March 1937 on board the *Lafonia* from South Georgia. Dorothy and John divorced in 1951. John, age 60 and a cook, went on holiday to the UK in 1965.
- 7. **Boy LANG** born 19 July 1906 on board the *Lafonia*. His father's occupation was recorded as shepherd. Died 20 July 1906, age 1 day, from inanition and was buried on Weddell Island.
- 8. **James Bradley LANG** born 24 September 1909 and baptised 24 September 1909 by Christ Church Cathedral. His father's occupation was recorded as seaman. James, age 8 months, died 4 June 1910 from bronchitis & convulsions and was buried 7 June 1910 in Grave A722.
- Henry Alexander Valentine LANG born 14 February 1913 in Stanley. His father's occupation was recorded as seaman. Henry, age 16, went to the UK in 1929 to enlist in HM navy.
- 10. Child LANG born April 1916. (Died with mother 5 April 1916?).

Children of Clara (5) (1) and Charles BETTS:

1. Elizabeth Margaret Mary BETTS born 20 May 1903 at Hill Cove and baptised 7 June 1903 by Christ Church Cathedral. Her father's occupation was recorded as labourer. Elizabeth was married to Murdo MORRISON, shepherd, 5 July 1922 at San Carlos, East Falkland by Special Licence by Alex Moir, Deputy Registrar. The witnesses were Richard Short and Edith Betts. Elizabeth's father was recorded as Charles Betts, cook, and Murdo's father was recorded as Murdo Morrison, labourer.

- 2. Edith BETTS born 21 August 1907 at Hill Cove and baptised 1 March 1908 by Christ Church Cathedral. Her father's occupation was recorded as foreman. Edith, age 23, was married to Percy Philip PECK, age 23 and a shepherd, 26 August 1930 at Christ Church Cathedral by Special Licence by F S Vaughan, Clerk in Holy Orders. The witnesses were James Watson Peck and Daphne Harriet Peck. Percy's father was recorded as John Peck, shepherd, and Edith's father was recorded as Charles Betts, gardener. Percy and Edith went on vacation to the UK in 1975.
- 3. **Eva BETTS** born 4 October 1909 at Hill Cove and baptised 30 October 1910 by Christ Church Cathedral. Her father's occupation was recorded as shepherd. Eva, a domestic servant, went to the UK in 945 join the forces. Eva was married to **James NORRIS**, widower and police officer from England, 18 October 1952 at the United Free Church (Tabernacle), Stanley by Walter Forrest McWhan, Minister. The witnesses were D E J Ikkint and E J Steen. Eva's father was recorded as Charles Betts, retired cook, and James' father was recorded as Harry Norris, deceased platelayer.
- 4. Frederick Charles BETTS born 11 February 1913 at San Carlos North and baptised 6 April 1913 by Christ Church Cathedral. His father's occupation was recorded as shepherd. Frederick, a labourer, was married to Isabella PECK 14 August 1940 at Christ Church Cathedral by Banns by Gerald K Lowe, Senior Chaplain. The witnesses were J D Middleton and Eva Betts. Frederick's father was recorded as Charles Betts, retired cook, and Isabella's father was recorded as George Peck, shepherd. Frederick, a foreman/handyman at FIC, and Isabella, retired to England in 1978 "for peace & quietness owing to sovereignty issue".
- 5. **George Robert BETTS** born 7 June 1917 at San Carlos North and baptised 15 June 1917 by Christ Church Cathedral. His father's occupation was recorded as shepherd. George, who was serving in the merchant navy, was posted as missing as a result of enemy action and a memorial service was held for him October 1942. [FI Weekly News 8 Oct 1942]

Children of Frederick (5) (2) and Minnie CHEEK:

- 1. Dorothy Elizabeth CHEEK born 12 October 1908 at Hill Cove. Her father's occupation was recorded as shepherd. Dorothy was married to George Richard Henry "Henry" NEWMAN, carpenter, 29 December 1928 at Christ Church Cathedral by Special Licence by S E E Aylward, Clerk in Holy Orders. The witnesses were Joseph Arthur David Newman and Henry Newing. Dorothy's father was recorded as Frederick Cheek, shepherd. Henry, a farm foreman, died 26 August 1968 at Teal Inlet and was buried 29 August 1968 in Grave T2109. Dorothy died 8 April 1996 in Stanley and was buried 13 April 1996 in Grave T2110.
- 2. Frederick John CHEEK born 16 May 1911. His father's occupation was recorded as shepherd. Frederick, a labourer, was married to Dorothy Mary Gladys JOHNSON 27 November 1937 at Hill Cove, West Falkland by Registrar General's Licence by H C Harding, Acting Registrar. The witnesses were Alfred G R Johnson and Eric T Johnson. Frederick's father was recorded as Frederick Cheek, deceased, and Dorothy's father was recorded as Edward Roach Johnson, handyman. Dorothy, age 68, died 24 January 1984. Frederick, age 83 and retired, died 14 August 1994 in Stanley.
- 3. **Alfred Henry CHEEK** born 14 December 1915 at Teal River, Hill Cove. His father's occupation was recorded as shepherd. Alfred, age 7 weeks, died 1 February 1916 from fermentative diarrhoea.

4. **Arthur Ernest CHEEK** born 20 April 1917 at Teal River, Hill Cove. His father's occupation was recorded as shepherd. Arthur, age 11 months, died 31 March 1918 at Fox Bay from tubercular meningitis.

Children of Elizabeth (5) (3) and Henry NEWING:

- 1. Annie Elizabeth NEWING born 3 July 1902 and baptised 14 September 1902 by Christ Church Cathedral. Her father's occupation was recorded as labourer. Annie was married to Maurice LEHEN, age 31, 24 March 1939 at 1121 Calle 21 de Mayo, Punta Arenas. Both were living in Punta Arenas at the time. The witnesses were A Gomez, Cecil Bertrand, Caroline Hardy and Nellie Conroy. Maurice's father was recorded as Daniel Lehen, retired, and Annie's father was recorded as Henry Newing, deceased. Both Maurice and Annie were resident in Punta Arenas at the time of wedding. Annie, age 73 and a widow, died 19 September 1975 in Stanley and was buried 22 September 1975 in Grave U1858. Maurice's ashes were buried on top 6 December 1977.
- 2. **Edwin NEWING** born 2 January 1904 in Stanley. His father's occupation was recorded as carter. Edwin died 3 January 1904 from defective development and inanition and was buried 4 January 1904 in Grave E403.
- 3. Dorothy Winifred NEWING born 28 February 1905 in Stanley and baptised 30 March 1905 by Christ Church Cathedral. Her father's occupation was recorded as carter. Dorothy was married to Markham James LUXTON, labourer, 24 August 1926 at Christ Church Cathedral by Banns by Fredk T Vaughan, Clerk in Holy Orders. The witnesses were Henry Newing and Annie Newing. Markham's father was recorded as John Thomas Luxton, cabinet maker.
- 4. Muriel Edith NEWING born 27 June 1910 in Stanley and baptised 28 July 1910 by Christ Church Cathedral. Her father's occupation was recorded as shepherd. Muriel was married to Cecil William Wickham BERTRAND, labourer, 4 February 1931 at Christ Church Cathedral by Special Licence by Fredk S Vaughan, Clerk in Holy Orders.
