

REIVE FAMILY

NB: The following is prepared from Falkland Islands Registers and files – there may be other family born outside the Falklands. Unless stated otherwise, all dated births, deaths and marriages occurred in the Falklands and all numbered graves are in Stanley Cemetery. Various spellings of names are recorded as written at the time.

Peter REEVE was born 9 March 1839 in Auchenrodden, Dumfriesshire, Scotland. [FIC/EF/22]

Peter, age 25, was married to **Elizabeth BATEMAN** in 1863 (*not in the Falkland Islands*).

Peter REIVE, age 24, left London 17 November 1866 on board the *Matilda*, a 220 ton British brig bringing cargo and shepherds for the Falkland Islands Company Limited. The *Matilda* arrived in Stanley 22 January 1867.

Elizabeth REIVE, age 27, with her sons, **William REIVE**, age 3, and **Robert REIVE**, age 10 months, left Swansea 29 May 1867 on board the *Epsilon*, a 548 ton British barque carrying stores for JM Dean & Sons and the Falkland Islands Company Ltd. The *Epsilon* arrived in Stanley 12 August 1867.

Peter, age 40 and a shepherd, was found drowned 15 January 1880 and was buried in Grave I 551.



Elizabeth was married to (2) **Franklin Herbert “Frank” BROWN**, seaman, 12 October 1881 at Teal Inlet, East Falkland according to the Rites and Ceremonies of the Established Church by Licence by Lowther E Brandon MA Colonial Chaplain. The witnesses were Enoch Gleadell and Sarah Gleadell. Elizabeth’s father was recorded as William Bateman, hatter and Franklin’s father was recorded as Samuel Brown, millwright. Both Elizabeth and Franklin were living at Teal Inlet at the time.

Elizabeth, age 70, died 4 June 1910 and is buried in Grave Ei721. Frank, age 68 and a mariner from the United States of America, died 3 September 1910 and is buried in Grave Ei726

FIRST GENERATION:

Children of Peter and Elizabeth REIVE:

1. **William REIVE** born circa 1864 (*not in Falkland Islands*).
2. **Robert “Bob” REIVE** born 21 July 1866 in Lochmaven, Scotland. Bob, a shepherd, was married to (1) **Alice BONNER**, age 23, 15 June 1891 in the house of Mrs Brown according to the Rites and Ceremonies of the Established Church by Licence by Lowther E Brandon MA Colonial Chaplain. The witnesses were John Bonner and Ellen Reive. Both Alice and Robert were living at Port Sussex at the time. Robert’s father was recorded as Peter Reive, shepherd, and Alice’s father was recorded as Samuel Bonner, manager. Alice, age 31, died at Port Sussex 25 May 1898 from exhaustion on acute maula and is buried in Grave A 83. Bob was married to (2) **Jessie COUTTS**, age 23, 25 August 1900 in the Parish Church according to the Rites & Ceremonies of the Established Church by Licence by Lowther E Brandon MA Dean & Colonial Chaplain. The witnesses were William Coutts and John Coutts. Robert was living at San Carlos South at the time and Jessie in Stanley. Robert’s father was recorded as Peter Reive, shepherd, and Jessie’s father was recorded at William Coutts, shepherd. Robert retired from being head shepherd at San Carlos in April 1932, retaining his house at Head of the Bay on pension. Robert, his wife and youngest son moved into Stanley on 22 February 1936. Robert, age 69 and a shepherd, died 27 February 1936 in Stanley and is buried in Grave K1092. [Obituary Penguin 3 Mar 1936, pg 2, 11 Mar 1936, pg 2] Jessie, age 57 and a widow, went to Montevideo for medical treatment in 1945. She was recorded as being 5’ tall with blue eyes and grey hair. Jessie, age 69, died 24 June 1946 and is buried in Grave P1324.

3. **Margaret Catherine REIVE** born 23 March 1869 at Brenton Loch and baptised 21 November 1869 by Holy Trinity Church. Her father’s occupation was recorded as shepherd. Margaret was married to **William Thomas LANNING**, mariner living in Stanley, 2 January 1893 in Christ Church according to the Rites and Ceremonies of the Established Church by Licence by Lowther E Brandon MA Dean & Colonial Chaplain. The witnesses were William Reive and Robert Reive. William’s father was recorded as Joseph Lanning, builder. William died 8 August 1920 and is buried in Grave Ei850. Margaret died 25 December 1949 and is buried in Grave E1420.

4. **Caroline REIVE** born 22 August 1870 in Stanley and baptised 30 December 1870 by Holy Trinity Church. Her father's occupation was recorded as shepherd. Caroline was married **Henry Horace SEDGWICK**, age 25, 29 November 1893 in the Tabernacle. Henry, FIC foreman age 35, died 31 December 1903 from cerebro spinal meningitis and is buried in Grave A31. Caroline, age 62 and a widow, went to the UK on holiday in 1932. She was recorded as being 5' 3" tall with blue eyes and dark brown hair. Caroline died 29 December 1957 in Stanley and is buried in Grave A1604.



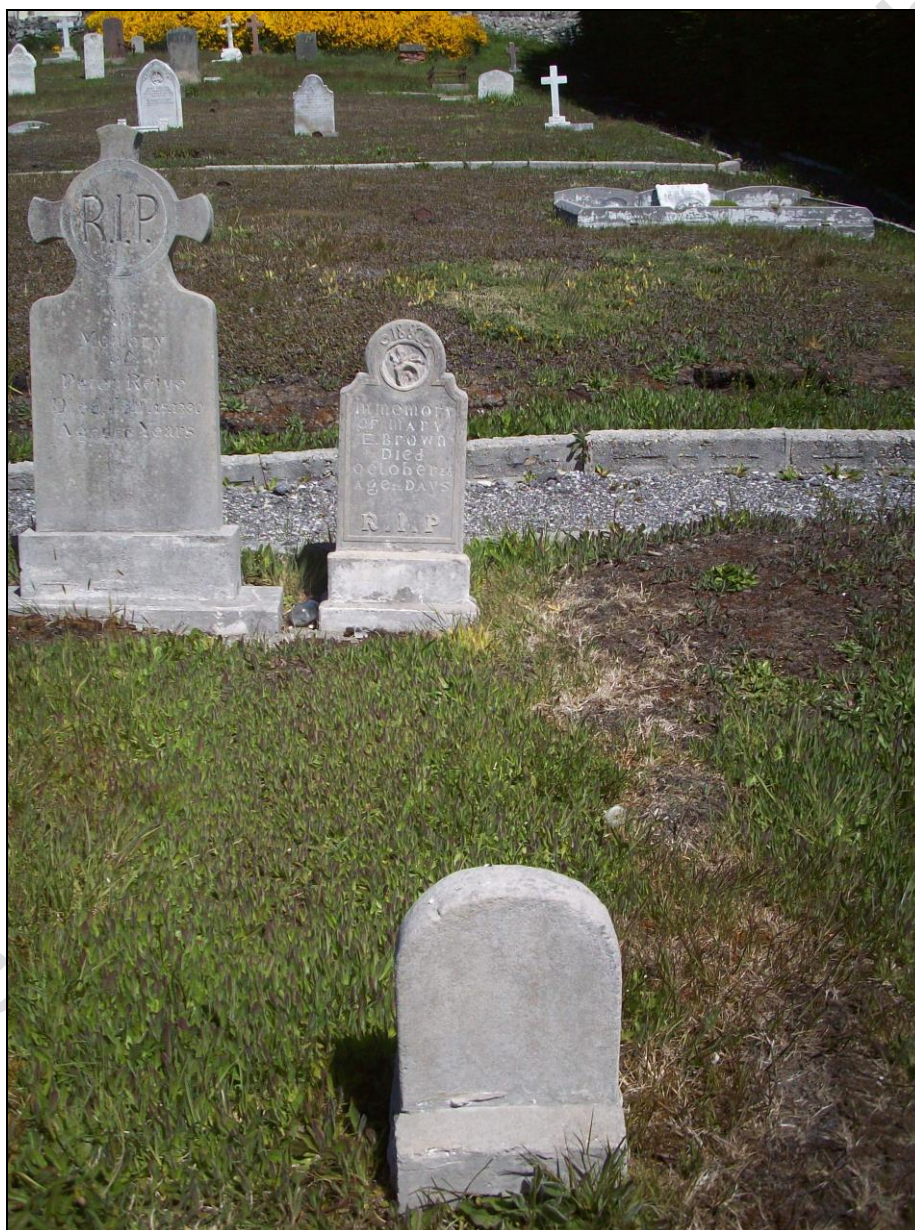
Caroline in 1932

5. **Andrew REIVE** born 29 November 1871 in Stanley. His father's occupation was recorded as shepherd. Andrew, a shepherd at Port Sussex, was married to **Ann COUTTS**, living at Cantera, 29 June 1899 in the house of Mr Coutts at Cantera, East Falkland according to the Rites & Ceremonies of the Established Church by Licence by Lowther E Brandon MA Dean & Colonial Chaplain. The witnesses were John David Evans and William Hawill. Ann's father was recorded as William Coutts, shepherd. Andrew, age 87 and a retired shepherd, died 18 September 1959 in Stanley. Ann, age 88 and a widow, died 13 January 1965 in Stanley.
6. **Helen REIVE** born 18 September 1873 at Diamond Cove, Berkeley Sound. Her father's occupation was recorded as shepherd. Helen was married to **William Basil DIXON**, age 24, 29 November 1893 in the Tabernacle. William came to the Falklands on board the *Knight Commander* arriving 1 June 1891. He was 3rd officer on board. Was a crewman on board the *Samson* for some time and then later was in charge of the *Plym*. [FIC/D11; p 900] William died 17 January 1923 and is buried in Grave li880. Helen died 17 May 1953 and is buried in Grave 1511.
7. **Thomas REEVES** born 26 July 1875 on New Island and baptised 21 February 1879 by Holy Trinity Church. father's occupation was recorded as shepherd. Thomas, a butcher, was married to **Isabella COUTTS** 7 September 1905 at Cantera, Darwin by Special Licence by Lowther E Brandon MA Dean & Colonial Chaplain. The witnesses were John Coutts and Elspet Coutts. Isabella's father was recorded as William Coutts, shepherd. Thomas, age 66 and a butcher, died 17 December 1941 and is buried in Grave J1201. Thomas had worked for the Falkland Islands Company Ltd over a period of 33 years. [FIC/EF/8#17] Isabella, age 73 and a widow, died 18 October 1959 in Stanley and is buried in Grave S1651.

8. **George REEVES** born 1 June 1877 on New Island and baptised 29 October 1877 by Holy Trinity Church. His father's occupation was recorded as shepherd. George, age 60 and a shepherd, drowned 18 August 1937 and is buried in Grave K1112.
9. **Elizabeth REEVES** born 24 December 1879 at Romford Harbour, St Salvador. Elizabeth, age 5 days, died 29 December 1879 from convulsions (*no burial record, possibly buried at Darwin*)

Children of Elizabeth and Franklin BROWN:

1. **Mary Elizabeth BROWN** born 2 October 1882 in Stanley. Mary died 26 October 1882 from inanition and is buried in Grave I 550 next to Peter Reive.



2. **Franklin Herbert BROWN** born 23 March 1884. Franklin, a shepherd, died age 36 at Douglas Station 12 December 1920 from influenza and is buried there.

SECOND GENERATION:

Children of Robert (2) and Alice REIVE:

1. **Elizabeth Alice REIVE** born 5 June 1892. Her father's occupation was recorded as shepherd. Elizabeth was married to **Hjalmar FUHLENDORFF**, seaman from Denmark, 7 July 1911 at Stanley by Special Licence by Robert Johnson, Nonconformist Minister. The witnesses were Silvester Barnes and Elizabeth Inglis Barnes. Hjalmar was appointed bosun of the ss *Falkland* in 1921. On 3 April 1930 Hjalmar, boson of the ss *Falkland*, was sentenced to 3 months hard labour & fined £25 for tampering with the mail on board. [Penguin 4 Apr 1930] Elizabeth died 11 July 1963 at Stanley and is buried in Grave T2001. Hjalmar died 28 September 1967 at Stanley and is buried in Grave T2002.

2. **Peter REIVE** born 31 May 1894 at Port Sussex. His father's occupation was recorded as shepherd. Peter, age 9 ½ died 22 November 1903 from tuberculosis and is buried in Grave A32.
3. **Robert REIVE** born 8 December 1895 at Port Sussex and baptised 11 December 1895 by Christ Church Cathedral. Robert, a coxswain, was married to **Emma Flora ALDRIDGE** 16 July 1924 at Christ Church Cathedral by J Stanley Smith, Clerk in Holy Orders. The witnesses were Ernest V Dixon and Joseph Aldridge. Robert's father was recorded as Robert Reive, shepherd, and Emma's father was recorded as Joseph Aldridge, caretaker. Robert, age 54 and a contractor, and Emma, age 49, went to Uruguay on holiday in 1950. Robert was recorded as being 5' 9" tall with blue eyes and grey hair and Emma was recorded as being 5' 4" tall with grey eyes and brown hair. Robert, age 59 and a handyman, died 23 March 1955 in Stanley from cancer and was buried 25 March 1955 in Grave Q1544. Emma, age 59 and a housewife travelled to the UK in 1960.

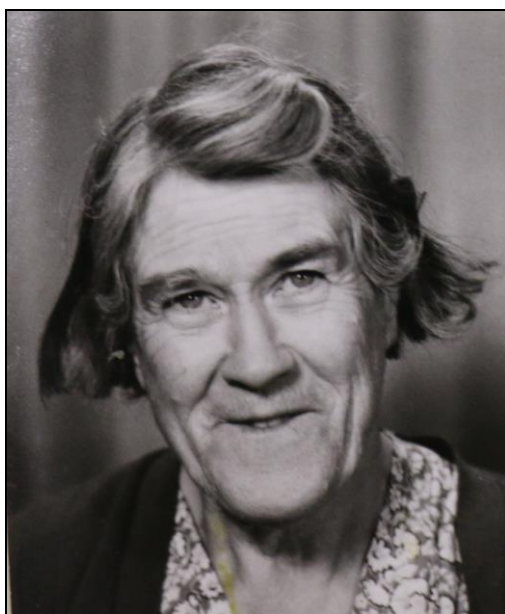


Robert and Emma in 1950

4. **Mary Alice REIVE** born 24 November 1897 and baptised 18 December 1897 by Christ Church Cathedral. Her father's occupation was recorded as shepherd. Mary, age 12, died 11 September 1909 at San Carlos South from pernicious anaemia (*no burial record*).

Children of Robert (2) and Jessie REIVE:

1. **Caroline REIVE** born 8 December 1902 at San Carlos South. Her father's occupation was recorded as shepherd. Caroline, a housekeeper, was married to **Donald McLEOD**, carter, 6 October 1923 at Darwin by Alexander Moir, Deputy Registrar. The witnesses were John McLeod and Peter Coutts. Donald's father was recorded as Alexander McLeod, shepherd. Caroline, age 66 and a housewife living at 7 Drury Street, went overseas in 1969. She was recorded as being 5' 2" tall with blue eyes and grey hair. Caroline, a boarding house keeper, died 3 August 1970 and is buried in Grave T2091.

2. **Elsie Ann REIVE** born 13 October 1904 at San Carlos. Her father's occupation was recorded as shepherd. Elsie was married to **George James ALAZIA**, shepherd, 26 February 1926 at San Carlos South by Special Licence by George Bonner JP (Deputy Registrar). The witnesses were Robert Reive and Arthur Alazia. George's father was recorded as George James Alazia. Elsie died 27 December 1947 and is buried in Grave P1366.
3. **Beatrice Ellen REIVE** born 1 June 1906 at San Carlos South. Her father's occupation was recorded as shepherd. Beatrice was married to (1) **Axel Richard August PETERSSON**, painter, 18 July 1928 at Christ Church Cathedral by Banns by S E E Aylward, Clerk in Holy Orders. The witnesses were John Pettersson and Anna Elizabeth Pettersson. Axel's father was recorded as Franz Axel Pettersson, foreman. Axel, a publican, drowned age 48 in a lifeboat accident in the Murrel River, 17 April 1949 and is buried in Grave Q1401. Beatrice, a widow and publican, was married to (2) **Stanley Howard JOHNSON**, widower and labourer, 11 October 1952 at the Office of the Registrar General, Stanley by H Bennett, Registrar General. The witnesses were Henry W A Stewart and V Pettersson. Stanley's father was recorded as George Frederick Johnson (deceased). Beatrice went on holiday to Montevideo in 1954. She was recorded as being 5' 6" tall with blue eyes and brown hair.

Beatrice died 28 August 1982 in Stanley and is buried in Grave Q1984. Stanley died 6 May 1997 in Stanley and is buried in Grave 3268.



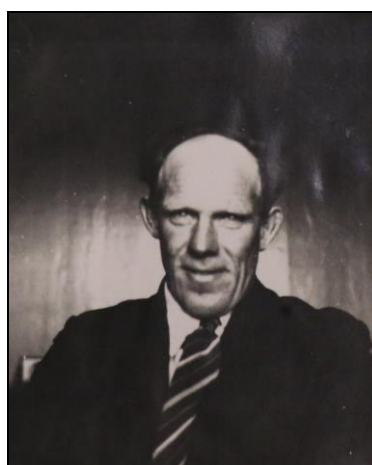
Beatrice in 1954

4. **Peter REIVE** born 11 April 1909. His father's occupation was recorded as shepherd. Peter, age 45 and a shepherd, went to the UK on holiday in 1955. He was recorded as being 5' 5" tall with blue eyes and dark hair. Peter, age 59 and a shepherd, died 10 December 1968 in Stanley and is buried in Grave T2122.

5. **John REIVE** born 15 November 1911 at San Carlos South. His father's occupation was recorded as shepherd. John, age 38 and a shepherd, went to Chile on holiday in 1950. He was recorded as being 5' 10" tall with blue eyes and dark hair.

6. **Ernest REIVE** born 17 August 1920 at San Carlos. His father's occupation was recorded as shepherd. Ernest was married to **Roma Endora Mary McGILL**, widow living at Johnsons Harbour, 28 September 1960 at St Mary's Roman Catholic Church, Stanley by James Ireland, Rt Rev Monsignor, Prefect Apolostic. The witnesses were S H Johnson and Thora Perry. Roma's father was recorded as Andrew Cameron Smith, sheep farmer. Ernest, age 43 and a shepherd, and Roma, age 47, went to Punta Arenas, Chile on holiday in 1964. Ernest was recorded as being 5' 9 $\frac{3}{4}$ " tall with blue eyes and grey hair and Roma was recorded as being 5' 3" tall with brown eyes and ginger greying hair. Ernest, age 74 and a pensioner, died 21 October 1994 and is buried in Grave V3218.

Children of Margaret (3) and William LANNING:

1. **Elizabeth Margaret LANNING** born 3 March 1894. Elizabeth was married to **Henry Charles Christopher NUNN**, widower and motor mechanic from England, 18 December 1927 at Christ Church Cathedral by Special Licence by Fredk S Vaughan, Clerk in Holy Orders. The witnesses were Ida Ellen Lanning and William Arthur Lanning. Henry's father was recorded as Henry Nunn, cab proprietor. Henry died 8 January 1963 in Stanley and is buried in Grave E1732.
2. **Alice Emily LANNING** born 19 March 1896. Alice was married to **Sydney Raisbeck SUMMERS**, carter, 27 April 1920 at Christ Church Cathedral by Banns by J Stanley Smith, Clerk in Holy Orders. The witnesses were Vere F Summers and A R Lanning. Sydney's father was recorded as John Falkland Summers, baker. Sydney, a radio telephone operator died 27 January 1968 in Stanley and is buried in Grave T2095. Alice died 12 October 1968 in Stanley and is buried in Grave T2096.
3. **Joseph Peter LANNING** born 23 March 1898. Joseph, a mariner, was married to **Emily HARRIES** 12 March 1922 at Christ Church Cathedral by Special Licence by J Stanley Smith, Clerk in Holy Orders. The witnesses were George Lanning and Winnifred Harries. Joseph's father was recorded as William Thomas Lanning, deceased mariner, and Emily's father was recorded as Joseph Harries, gardener. On 9 December 1931 Joseph bought Crown Grant 27 (now 41 Fitzroy Road and 5 & 7 Philomel Street) for £250. On 14 February 1933 Joseph sold the property for £250. Joseph was appointed a police constable 1 January 1932 on an annual salary of £126 and provided with a uniform, unfurnished

quarters and fuel allowance. In 1936 his salary was increased to £138 and in 1937 to £150. In 1942 he was on the same salary and conditions but seconded for service with the Royal Navy. In 1943 his salary was increased to £160 and in 1944 to £170 (conditions and secondment still in place). In 1944 Joseph was a skipper, RNR and went to the UK on the expiration of Foreign Service. He was recorded as being 5' 10" tall with brown eyes and dark hair. Emily, age 44, went to the UK to reside in 1945. She was recorded as being 5' tall with blue eyes and brown/grey eyes. Emily's ashes were returned to the Falkland Islands and buried in her son James' grave, L1255.

4. **Edward Andrew LANNING** born 4 October 1901. Edward, a labourer, died 28 November 1921 from disseminated sclerosis, paraplegia and apoplexy and is buried in Grave Ei865.
5. **Agnes Reives LANNING** born 13 February 1903 on Keppel Island. Agnes, a domestic servant, was married to **Donald MacDONALD**, bricklayer, 12 January 1933 at the Registrar's Office, Stanley by Special Licence by G R L Brown, Registrar General. The witnesses were Ida Ellen Lanning and C H Thompson. Donald's father was recorded as John MacDonald, Stone cutter. Donald was born 21 February 1902 in Oban, Argyle, Scotland. Agnes and Donald emigrated to the UK via Montevideo in 1933 to reside.
6. **Violet Caroline LANNING** born 1 May 1904 in Stanley. Violet was married to **William Richard WALLIN**, labourer, 7 September 1929 at the Registrar's Office, Stanley by Special Licence by M Craigie Halkett, Registrar General. The witnesses were Ida Ellen Lanning and William Arthur Lanning. William's father was recorded as Gethroh Wallin (deceased). William was born 16 June 1907 in Cold Ash, Thatchum, Berkshire, UK. Violet and William went to Chile in 1929 to work. They both emigrated to England in 1952 to find work and live.
7. **George Thomas LANNING** born 19 July 1905 in Stanley. Appointed second class wireless operator in the South Georgia W/T Station 11 June 1925 and working there in 1931. Working at the Stanley Wireless Telegraph Station in 1933. Still there in 1944.
8. **Ida Ellen LANNING** (twin) born 17 April 1908 in Stanley. Ida was married to **Hugh HANNING**, missionary, 28 September 1935 at the Registrar's Office, Stanley by Special Licence by A R Hoare, Ag Registrar General. The witnesses were L B White and A W Beardmore. Hugh's father was recorded as Hugh Hanning, estate agent. Hugh was born in Aurdrie 3 Jul 1907. Hugh and Ellen left in 1935.

9. **William Arthur LANNING** (twin) born 17 April 1908 in Stanley. Carter. In November 1933 purchased Crown Grant 403 (Callaghan Road, now Government Housing land) for £65. In November 1936 he sold a strip of land at the front to the Government for £6.12s. In 1938 he sold the remainder of the plot for £100.

Children of Caroline (4) and Henry SEDGWICK:

1. **Frederick Aubrey SEDGWICK** born 8 February 1895. His father's occupation was recorded as labourer. Frederick, a mariner, was married to **Malvina Frances AIKEN**, divorced, 10 June 1937 at the Registrar's Office, Stanley by Special Licence by A W Beardmore, Registrar General. The witnesses were William Henry Sedgwick and Daisy May Betts. Frederick's father was recorded as Henry Horace Sedgwick, deceased seaman, and Malvina's father was recorded as George Rowlands, deceased carpenter. Malvina, age 36 and a housewife living on Fitzroy Road, went to Montevideo on holiday in 1946. She was recorded as being 4' 10 ½" tall with grey eyes and black hair. Frederick, age 56 and a mariner, emigrated to the UK in 1951. He was recorded as being 5' 10 ¼ " tall with blue eyes, brown hair and tattoos on his arms.

2. **William Henry "Bill" SEDGWICK** born 5 August 1896. His father's occupation was recorded as mariner. William was injured on board the *Oropesa* on 2 October 1924. His left thumb was crushed, the nail wrenched off and the flesh torn across to the pad on the front of the thumb. Due to inflammation of the bone he was off work until Tuesday 11 November 1924. [FIC/WS/PSN] William, a carpenter, was married to **Elliot Fell CAMPBELL** 19 June 1918 at Christ Church Cathedral by Banns by J Stanley Smith, Clerk in Holy Orders. The witnesses were Bertrand A Sedgwick and Agnes Campbell. William's father was recorded as Henry Horace Sedgwick, foreman, and Elliot's father was recorded as James Campbell (deceased), shepherd. William, age 47 and a carpenter, and Elliot, age 49, went to Montevideo on holiday in 1943. William was recorded as being 5' 11" tall with grey eyes and brown hair. Elliot was recorded as being 5' 1" tall with blue eyes and brown hair. Elliot died 7 November 1960 in Stanley and is buried in Grave S1682. Bill emigrated to New Zealand and later died there.

3. **Bertrand Arthur SEDGWICK** born 22 April 1898 in Stanley. His father's occupation was recorded as mariner. Bertrand, a sailor, was married to **Mary Jane McCARTHY** 5 May 1925 at Darwin Harbour by Special Licence by Alex Moir, Deputy Registrar & JP. The witnesses were Henry Horace Sedgwick and Nora McCarthy. Bertrand's father was recorded as Henry Horace Sedgwick, deceased foreman labourer, and Mary's father was recorded as Michael McCarthy, shepherd. Bertrand, age 58 and an engineer, went to the UK in 1956 for medical treatment. He was recorded as being 5' 11" tall with blue eyes and dark brown hair. Mary, age 53, emigrated to the British Commonwealth in 1958. She was recorded as being 5' 2" tall with dark grey eyes and grey and black hair.

4. **Lawrence Adrian SEDGWICK** born 14 September 1902. His father's occupation was recorded as mariner. Lawrence, a merchant, was married to **Isabella Irene ATKINS** 22 June 1927 at Christ Church Cathedral by Banns by Fredk S Vaughan, Clerk in Holy Orders. The witnesses were Henry Horace Sedgwick and Dorothy Malvina Atkins. Lawrence's father was recorded as Henry Horace Sedgwick, deceased mariner, and Isabella's father was recorded as Richard Daniel Atkins, engineer.
5. **Henry Horace SEDGWICK** born 22 August 1904. His father's occupation was recorded as deceased FI Company Ltd foreman. Henry, age 43 and a printer, went to Montevideo for medical treatment in 1948. He was recorded as being 5' 8 $\frac{3}{4}$ " tall with grey eyes and dark

brown hair. Henry, head printer, died 19 November 1959 in Stanley and is buried in Grave A1652.

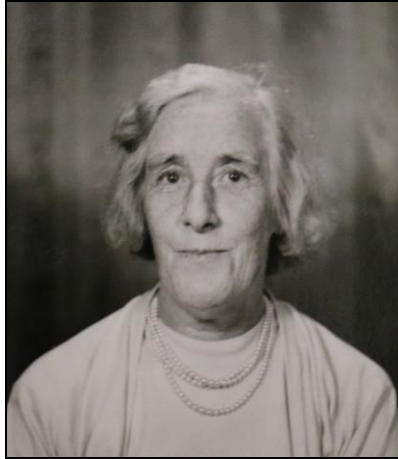
1. **Ellen REIVE** born 19 September 1900 at Cantera. Her father's occupation was recorded as shepherd. Ellen was married to **John Dickson McCALLUM**, shepherd, 26 February 1926 by Special Licence by George Bonner JP (Deputy Registrar). The witnesses were Andrew Reive and Andrew Reive (Junior). John's father was recorded as James Alexander McCallum, shepherd. John died 21 August 1950 and is buried on Douglas Station. Ellen, age 70 and a housewife living at Teal Inlet, went to the UK on holiday in 1971. She was recorded as being 5' 3 1/2" tall with grey eyes and greying hair. Ellen died 26 July 1995 and is buried in Grave V3232.

2. **Elizabeth Ann REIVE** born 29 November 1901 at Cantera. Her father's occupation was recorded as shepherd. Elizabeth was married to (1) **Allan Alexander Dickson "Alexander" McCULLUM**, widower and shepherd, 6 March 1929 at Darwin Harbour by Special Licence by Edwin George Creece, Registrar. The witnesses were William Frederick Britton and Isabella Reive. Alexander's father was recorded as James Alexander McCullum (deceased). Alexander died age 43 of cardiac failure, 11 February 1942 at San Carlos and is buried at Port San Carlos. Elizabeth was married to (2) **William Richard Bird PARRIN**,

shepherd, 2 June 1951 at the Office of the Registrar General, Stanley by H Bennett, Registrar General. The witnesses were G Reive, W Duncan and D Duncan. William's father was recorded as William Mendoza Parrin (deceased). William died 3 July 1961 in Stanley and is buried in Grave S1697. Elizabeth, age 62 and a widow, went to Uruguay for medical treatment in 1964. She was recorded as being 5' 6" tall with grey eyes and grey hair. Elizabeth died 13 August 1966 in Stanley and is buried in Grave T2064.

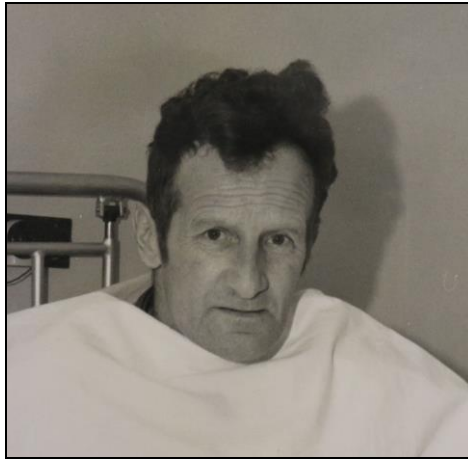
3. **Andrew REIVE** born 18 May 1903 at Port Sussex. His father's occupation was recorded as shepherd. Andrew, age 35 and a shepherd, drowned 18 August 1937 at Lively Island and is buried at Darwin.
4. **William John REIVE** born 20 February 1905 at Port Sussex. His father's occupation was recorded as shepherd. William, age 24 and a shepherd, went to the Argentine Republic on business in 1929. He was recorded as being 5' 8 3/4" tall with blue eyes and fair hair. William, age 62 and a farmhand, died 27 June 1967 in Stanley and is buried in Grave T2077.

5. **Isabella REIVE** born 26 February 1907 at Sussex, San Carlos. Her father's occupation was recorded as shepherd. 6. **George REIVE** born 17 February 1909 at Sussex, San Carlos. His father's occupation was recorded as shepherd. George, age 50 and a labourer living at 14 Drury Street, went to Montevideo for medical treatment in 1959. He was recorded as being 5' 9 5/8" tall with blue eyes and brown hair. George, age 63 and a painter, died 1 February 1973 in Stanley and is buried in Grave U2200.

8. **Mary Ann REIVE** born 17 September 1915 at Sussex, San Carlos and baptised 4 November 1916 by Christ Church Cathedral. Her father's occupation was recorded as shepherd. Mary was married to **Wallace Carl Linden HIRTLE**, school teacher, 20 February 1939 at Christ Church Cathedral by Banns by Gerald K Lowe, Senior Chaplain. The witnesses were L Hirtle and E Hirtle. Wallace's father was recorded as Robert John Hirtle, mariner. Wallace died 13 September 1993 and is buried in Grave 3195. Mary died 28 September 2001 and is buried in Grave V3194.

The witnesses were D H McMillan, d McCallum and R McCallum. Alexander's father was recorded as Roderick Finlayson, overseer. Dorothy, age 36, went to the UK on holiday in 1955. She was recorded as being 5' 3" tall with blue eyes and auburn hair.

Ernest was educated at the Government School, Stanley. Ernest was taken on as a member of the crew of the ss *Potosi* and travelled to the UK in 1919. Ernest, a labourer, was married to **Mary KIDDLE** 19 June 1925 at Christ Church Cathedral by Special Licence by J Stanley Smith, Clerk in Holy Orders. The witnesses were John F Summers and Isabella Summers. Ernest's father was recorded as William Basil Dixon, deceased, and Mary's father was recorded as Albert Kiddle, shepherd. Ernest was appointed gunner on probation on the HMCS *Afterglow* 11 December 1925 and held the position until 31 December 1927. Ernest was appointed storekeeper in the Public Works Department 1 July 1928. Ernest, age 41 and a civil servant, was sent to the UK to undergo three months training in the mechanics and driving of a power boat. He departed 28 February 1937 on board the *Lafonia*, returning 30 July 1937. Ernest, age 51 and a clerk, and Mary, age 44, went on holiday to the UK and Norway in 1947. Ernest retired on pension 19 July 1958. Ernest, age 63 and a retired civil servant, died 26 February 1959 in Stanley and was buried 1 March 1959 in Grave S 1627. Mary died in the UK.

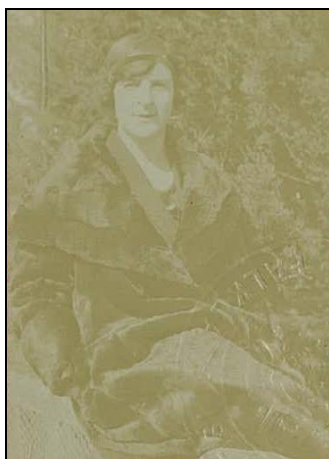
3. **Frederick Basil DIXON** born 3 February 1897 in Stanley and baptised 9 May 1897 by Christ Church Cathedral. His father's occupation was recorded as seaman. Frederick was educated at the Government School, Stanley. Frederick departed 12 June 1919 for Punta Arenas on board the *Antartico*. He returned 9 November 1922 on board the *Ortega* from Liverpool. Frederick, a painter, was married to **Dorothy Maud RICHES**, school teacher, 31 May 1930 at Christ Church Cathedral by Banns by F S Vaughan, Clerk in Holy Orders. The witnesses were Ernest V Dixon and V Riches. Frederick's father was recorded as William Basil Dixon, deceased, and Dorothy's father was recorded as Sidney Herbert Riches, customs officer. Frederick departed 17 September 1935 on board the *Lafonia* bound for Port Stephens with the Cape Meredith light. He arrived from Kitt's Creek 29 September 1935. Frederick was appointed temporary constable and handyman at South Georgia 1 February 1943 and he, his wife and child, departed for South Georgia on the ss *Fitzroy* early 1943. His wife and child departed South Georgia for the UK on board the *Harpon* in 1945. Frederick's service terminated 27 April 1946.

Winnifred was appointed a junior clerk in the Post Office in 1923. She was granted a leave of absence in 1926. Winnifred arrived 3 November 1926 on board the *Orepesa* from the UK. Winnifred was married to **Alexander MERCER**, wireless operator, 11 October 1930 at Christ Church Cathedral by Banns by F S Vaughan, Clerk in Holy Orders. The witnesses were J

Mercer and M Mercer. Alexander's father was recorded as Alexander Mercer, carpenter, and Winifred's father was recorded as William Basil Dixon, mariner. Winnifred and Alexander went to the UK in 1960.

Percy was baptised 19 May 1934 by Christ Church Cathedral. Percy started with the Falkland Islands Co Ltd as an apprentice carpenter 1 January 1929 and completed his apprenticeship 31 December 1934. By June 1948 he had been employed continuously and was recorded as being sober, industrious and an excellent craftsman. [FIC/EF/] Percy, a carpenter, was married to **Georgina Elizabeth MIDDLETON** 15 April 1942 at Christ Church Cathedral by Special Licence by Gerald K Lowe, Senior Chaplain. The witnesses were J D Middleton and A D Scott. Percy's father was recorded as William Basil Dixon, deceased, and Georgina's father was recorded as James Middleton, foreman. Georgina, Percy and their children travelled to the UK in 1948. In 1952 Percy was working as foreman carpenter for the Falkland Islands Co Ltd. On 31 August 1953 Percy signed a five year contract with the Falkland Islands Company Ltd as a foreman carpenter and superintendent. [FIC/IC1#7] Georgina, Percy and their children emigrated to New Zealand in 1957. Percy died in New Zealand in 2001. In 2007 Georgina was living in Auckland, New Zealand. Ann, age 49 and a widow, her daughter Dilys and dog, emigrated to Canada via Montevideo early 1958. [FIC/EF/] Ann was recorded as being 5' 4" tall with blue eyes and brown hair.

She finished training in January 1935 and gained general nursing certificates of St Mary's Hospital and of the General Nursing Council. She also obtained a certificate of the Central Midwives Board. Gertrude started work at KEM Hospital as a nursing sister on Monday 15 July 1935 on an annual salary of £160 rising by annual increments of £10 to £180 per annum. She also received free furnished quarters and board in the hospital. Gertrude was appointed nurse-matron of KEM Hospital 2 February 1937. Gertrude applied for overseas service and was appointed nursing sister in Nigeria. She departed for Nigeria 1 November 1939. Gertrude resigned her position in Lagos to marry in April 1943. She was recorded as being 5' 5 ½ " tall with green eyes and brown hair. Eleanor died 21 May 1976 in Stanley and is buried in Grave U1873. Leonard was manager of Estate Louis Williams Limited. The witnesses were H H Sedgwick and P M Atkins. Karl's father was recorded as Albert Ferdinand Lellman, carpenter. Mary, age 25, went to South America and the British Isles on vacation in 1939. She was recorded as being 5' 2" tall with blue eyes and light brown hair. Karl, age 43 and a town clerk, and Mary, age 39, emigrated to New Zealand via the UK in 1953. Karl was recorded as being 5' 5" tall with brown eyes and dark brown hair and Mary was recorded as being 5' 2" tall with blue eyes and light brown hair. Karl, age 100, died 5 August 2010 in Auckland, New Zealand. His obituary published in the New Zealand Herald read '*LELLMAN, Karl. On Thursday 5 August 2010 at Beechworth Home And Hospital; in his 101st year. Loved husband of the late Mal. Loved father and father-in-law of Michael and Pauline and John and Robyn. The witnesses were Leonard Lawrence Reive and Winifred May Meierhofer. Charles' father was recorded as Thomas Reive, butcher, and Irene's father was recorded as George John Meierhofer, engineer. Charles was employed in government service from 1934 and retired as Senior Technician and Broadcasting Officer in 1973. Irene, age 29 and a housewife, went to Montevideo for medical treatment in 1950. She was recorded as being 5' 1" tall with brown eyes and dark brown hair. Charles, age 35 and an electrician, went to the UK on holiday in 1955. He was recorded as being 5' 11 $\frac{3}{4}$ " tall with grey eyes and fair hair.
