I hereby certify that the United States Barge "Ortona" Captain Carleton was accidentally totally burnt in this harbour on the night of the - and as no opportunity is likely to occur more favourable for Captain Carleton and his two mates to return to America than that which now offers by the British Barge "Blymene" Captain Smith, I hereby request that you will pay on account of your Government to Captain Smith the sum of \$6 per day for each man, as the length of passage may show.

This rate is in conformity with the regulation of the British Government with Masters of Merchant Ships for the conveyance of distressed mariners

No Two Hundred & Eighty two dated 1st May 1885
The sum of Five Hundred Pounds drawn in favour of J. M. Dean; in exchange for cash to be expended in the general service of the Colony

No Two Hundred and Eighty three dated 2nd May 1885
The sum of Eighty Pounds drawn in favour of Elizabeth Mary Simons; in exchange for cash to be expended in the general service of the Colony

These two Bills are drawn on the authority of Sir J. Grey's despatch no 10 dated 28th October 1854 authorising the expenditure of 1855-6

Sir

I have the honor to acknowledge the receipt of your letter dated the 22nd instant which I have laid before H. E. the Governor with the enclosed list of Aliens. —

2. — His Excellency directs me to say that he has no wish to send out of the colony any Foreigners who are willing to work steadily, and conduct themselves honestly, but the enquiries he has caused to be instituted respecting the Aliens now in Stanley has induced him to direct that the men named in the margin shall be sent away by the first opportunity, as they have for the most part been for a considerable time resident in Stanley without any ostensible mode of earning a livelihood.

3. — The Governor will therefore provide these men with employment on the Government Works until an opportunity offers for their conveyance to the River, unless they can otherwise secure a passage. —

4. — Two of these men Felipe Baravalle and Tiburcio Azeu state that they hold an order for a passage. The former says that a man named Gonzales transferred to him in payment for a debt an order for a passage to which Gonzales was entitled at the Company's expense, the latter states that he holds an order given him by Mr. Dale. Should the statements of these men be correct His Excellency would have no wish to interfere with them on the understanding that they are to be furnished with a passage by the "Victoria".
