We the undersigned being settlers at Port Louis, Berkeley Sound, East Falkland are willing to conform to all such orders and directions as may from time to time be promulgated by the Government of Great Britain by the Commander in Chief on the Station or by the Officer in charge of the Settlement, for the better regulation thereof and of the Islands Generally. In witness whereof we have here-unto set our hands at the time and place noted against them.

[H1, 227] Was discharged Tuesday 23 February 1841 from employment as capatz due to breach of contract. [H1; 247b] Bill drawn in favour of Basilio GILLERAC 1 July 1843 for £70-6-2

[H1; 211b] In the morning COLLINGS and JONES were placed in confinement 15 Oct 1840 and were sent on board HMS <i>Actaeon</i> for passage to Valparaiso for repeated acts of insubordination of the grossest kind.
