SITUATION AND AREA.

The Falkland Islands lie in the South Atlantic between 51° and 53° S. latitude and between 57° and 62° W. longitude. The total area of the group was given in the Colonization Circular (1874) of the Colonial Land and Emigration Commissioners as 6,500 square miles, and this area was for many years generally adopted in official reports, including the Report of Census, 1921. No land survey has been carried out, but it is clear that in the past the size of the Colony has been much over-estimated. The area, as computed by measurement from the Admiralty Chart, is 4,618 square miles, of which it is estimated that Stanley, the only town or settlement with over 100 inhabitants, occupies three quarters of a square mile.

The Dependencies consist of the land and sea between longitude 20° W. and 50° W, south of latitude 50° S, and between longitude 50° W. and 80° W, south of latitude 58° S. The island of South Georgia, lying in 54½° S, and between 36° and 38° W. longitude, is the only portion of these territories habitable all the year round. The area of the island is generally accepted as about 1,000 square miles, but there is reason to believe that this figure is considerably in excess of its actual size. With the exception of a small staff of Government officials, resident on the island throughout the year, the population consists solely of the personnel of the whaling stations established on the narrow coastal strip fringing some of the numerous bays on the north-east, and varies from 1,000 persons and upwards during the working season (September to May) to less than 400 persons at other times of the year. So far as is known, the only persons within the boundaries of the Dependencies on the night of the Census were the community at South Georgia and the personnel of a whaling expedition returning from deep sea operations in the South Shetlands area.

PART II.

COLONY.

Based on the area given in Part I of this Report, the average density of population in the Colony generally is approximately 1 person to 2 square miles.

The following figures show the distribution of the population.

TABLES I & II. It will be seen that during the past decade the population has increased by 298 persons, of whom 169 are males and 129 are females. The rate of increase is 14.2% and is the same in the case of both sexes.

Out of a total population of 2,392 the number of young people under 20 years of age is shown to be 942. It is interesting to note that this is identically the figure recorded in 1921, when the total population stood at 2,094. In that year, however, the number of males under 20 was less and the number of females greater by 21. During the past ten years the juvenile population, under the age of 15, has likewise remained stationary, the actual number in 1921 being 712, as compared with 714 in 1931, or 30% of the present total population. Of the latter number, 441 are children of 5 years and over, the remainder, 273, being infants.

The increase of population in the Colony generally is more than accounted for by the growth of Stanley which has added over one-third of its numbers as recorded in 1921. On the other hand, while there is a rise of numbers in the West Falklands, there is a slight falling off in the country districts of the East Falklands, resulting in a net decrease in the Camp population of 69. While very little change would seem to have taken place in the population of Darwin & Lafonia, there is a marked decrease in "Other Districts" especially among the male population between the ages of 20 and 50. The number of children domiciled on the East Falkland Sheepfarms is 220, as compared with 293 in 1921.

Of the 51 persons recorded under "Shipping," 17 are natives of the Colony with homes in Stanley, 16 belong to the country districts, chiefly in the West Falklands, and 18 represent members of the crews of the local vessels, "Falkland" and "Fleurus," who do not reside in the Colony.

CIVIL CONDITION OF THE POPULATION.

TABLE III. The number of married persons in the Colony is shown to be 874, of whom 444 are males and 430 are females. Married persons between the ages of 20 and under 50 represent 74.5% of the total.

Unmarried persons, including those widowed or divorced, but excluding persons under the age of 20, number 586, of whom 400 are males and 186 are females. Of these the greater proportion is to be found between the ages of 20 and under 30, the number in this period being no less than 54.8% of the total.

The number of persons returned as illiterate is 34, and the number of persons suffering infirmity, 12, of whom 4 are mutes. The number of foreigners unable to speak English is recorded as 9.

STANLEY.

Applying the average rate of increase in the population of the Colony to the population of Stanley as it was in 1921, the town should have attained during the decade a maximum of 1,016 inhabitants. An examination of the schedules reveals that in addition to its natural growth the capital has received over 160 persons from the country districts and a few from Patagonia.

The number of inhabitants recorded is 1,213, as compared with 890 in 1921. The rate of increase of the male population over that of the female population is 7%, both sexes being now almost on a numerical level. The actual figures are 609 and 604 respectively. The increase is most marked among persons between the ages of 20 and under 40, the actual number in this period being 153, or 47% of the total increase. The number of children under the age of 15 has risen by 64, and the total number of young people under 20 by 73.

TABLES I & IV. The number of houses in Stanley shows an increase, during the decade, of 88. Of this number 13 are new houses, unoccupied, but for the most part in an advanced stage of construction. There is also included in the total one uninhabited house,

condemned as unsuitable for occupation. The figures would appear to show one or two cases of overcrowding, but on examination these have been found less serious than would at first seem.

INDUSTRIES.

TABLES V & VI. The only industry shown by the Schedules is sheepfarming, the Sealing Station at Albemarle, West Falklands, having closed down for the season prior to the date of the Census. The number of men employed directly in the sheepfarming industry and resident on the farms on the night of the Census is recorded as 443, as compared with 447 in 1921. It should be taken into account, however, that some 30 men belonging to the industry were either in Stanley or on board the s.s. "Falkland" when the Census was taken. It may be concluded from a comparison of the figures recorded in 1921 that very little change has taken place in the industry as a source of employment, during the past ten years.

Stanley has no industry apart from being the port and distributing centre of the islands. It has been found convenient, for the purpose of showing the extent and nature of the employment available, to classify the occupations under the chief employing agencies. It will be seen that out of a total of approximately 460 persons in or seeking employment, 60% are employed by the Government and the Falkland Islands Company. The number of general labourers out of work is shown as 28.

NATIONALITY, BIRTHPLACES, & RELIGION.

TABLE VII. With one or two exceptions the population is of pure European race. The nationality of 97% is British: 80% are natives of the Colony, and 16% either of the United Kingdom or other British possessions. Seventy-three per cent belong to the Anglican Church and 15 per cent to the Roman Catholic Church.

PART III.

DEPENDENCIES.

TABLES VIII & IX. Compared with the figures contained in the Census Report of 1921, there is a decrease of 628, accounted for by the earlier suspension of whaling operations for the season in 1931. With few exceptions the community in the Dependencies is Norwegian in nationality and Lutheran in religion: 45% were returned as being able to speak English. The number engaged in the different occupations of the whaling industry are shown in Table IX.
