# Report of CENSUS 1972

STANLEY,

FALKLAND ISLANDS. 9th March 1973

Sir,

Under the powers vested in the Governor by Section 3 of the Census Ordinance (Cap. 8) I was appointed on the 6th November 1972, to be Census Supervisor to take the Census for this Colony.

2. Arrangements were made and the Census was taken on the 3rd December 1972, the appointed day.

3. The total population on Census day was 1,957, of whom 1,081 were males and 876 females. The comparative figures for the 1962 Census were -2,172, 1,195 and 977 respectively.

4. On the 3rd December 1972, Albert Ferdinand Lellman aged 91 of Stanley was the oldest male inhabitant and Mary Edith Harvey aged 88 of Stanley was the oldest female inhabitant.

5. I would like to record my appreciation of the conscientious and efficient manner in which the enumerators Mr. W. A. Felton and Mr. W. J. Jones of the Police and Prisons Department carried out their duties. In particular I wish to express my gratitude to Mrs. R. Clements who was responsible for analysing the data from the Schedules.

Colony of the Falkland Islands - (Excluding the Dependencies)

Report of Census taken on the 3rd December, 1972.

1. The population figures given for the years 1851, 1861 and 1871 are estimated, while those given for the years 1881 onwards are taken from past Census reports.

2. Included in the total population of 1,957 are 36 Royal Marines stationed in the Colony and 14 members of the Argentine Airfield Construction Team who were in the Colony for the purpose of constructing a temporary airfield, but not the crews (67 males) of locally registered ships at sea on Census day.

3. For the first time this century the population has fallen below 2,000.

4. Distribution of Population by Age Group and Sex - Tables II and IIA. During the past ten years the total population decreased from 2,172 by 215 persons (114 males and 101 females). The population of Stanley increased by 5 from 1,074 to 1,079 (the male population increased by 53 and the female decreased by 48). The East Falkland shows a decrease of 99 (72 males and 27 females) from 587 to 498 while that of the West Falkland decreased from 460 to 380 (57 males and 25 females).

5. Table IIA shows the percentage under certain age groups and sex as compared with the 1962 Census.

6. Marital Status by Age Group and Sex - Tables III and IIIA. Table III shows the marital status of the population by age group and sex compared with the 1962 Census, while Table IIIA shows comparative percentages according to age groups of the marital status of the population in 1962 and 1972.

7. Births and Birth Rates during the period 1962 - 1972 — Table IV. This Table shows the number of children of each sex registered as being born during the period 1962 - 1972 to parents normally resident in the Colony. The birth rate per thousand is based on the population figures prepared annually by the Registrar General.

8. Deaths and Death Rates during the period 1962 - 1972 — Table V. Table V. shows the number of registered deaths among persons of both sex forming part of the normally resident population resident in the Colony during 1962 - 1972. As in the case of births the death rate is based on the figures prepared annually by the Registrar General.

9. Population by Birthplace and Sex - Table VI. The 1962 Census showed that 1,733 persons were locally born and 338 born in the United Kingdom. The 1972 Census shows that 1,520 were locally born and 333 born in the United Kingdom.

10. Population by Nationality and Sex - Table VII. It will be seen from this Table that 1,891 of the population or 96.78% are British Subjects and the remaining 63 or 3.22% are divided among 11 nationalities.

11. Distribution of Population by Occupation - Tables VIII, A & B. These Tables are divided to show the occupation of females as well as males.

12. Classification has been determined by work performed and not by occupational nomenclature.

13. Population by Religion - Table IX. There were 1,060 or 54.21% of the population belonging to the Anglican Church as compared with 1,406 or 64.73% at the Census in 1962. The non-conformists show an increase from 498 to 537 and the Roman Catholics a decrease from 236 to 216.

14. Housing Accommodation - Table X. This gives details relating to the distribution of population according to living room units and included information relating to occupied and unoccupied houses, water supply, sanitation, baths and the birthplace of the head of each household. Household relates to all persons sleeping under the same roof.

15. Natural growth of the Population - Table XI. The average number of births registered during the past ten years (1962 - 1972) was 43 while the average number of deaths registered over the same period was 21, thus showing an average increase in the population of 22. The average increase is the same as for the nine preceding years (1953 - 1961).

16. Immigration and Emigration - Table XII. The data shown in this Table did not result from the Census, but is included in this report because of its relevance when considering population trends.

17. During the ten years (1962 - 1971) immigrants averaged 363 and emigrants 399, showing an annual exodus of 36 persons during that period, compared with 39 persons during the preceding nine years.
