# REPORT OF CENSUS 1980

STANLEY,

FALKLAND ISLANDS.

11th February 1981.

Sir,

Under the powers vested in the Governor by Section 3 of the Census Ordinance I was appointed on the 7th November 1980 to be Census Supervisor to take the Census for this Colony.

2. The Census was taken on the 7th December 1980, the appointed day.

3. The total population of the Colony (excluding the Dependencies) on the Census day was 1,813. In addition, there were stationed in the Colony on the Census day 42 Royal Marines living at Moody Brook Barracks. The figure of 1,813 includes one Royal Marine having a household in Stanley and not living at the Barracks. Two ships, namely the R.R.S. "John Biscoe" and the R.R.S. "Bransfield", were in Stanley Harbour on the Census day but were not included in the Census.

4. I would like to express my great thanks to the Executive Assistants, Mr. W. C. Hirtle, who did much of the preparatory work, and Mr. S. A. Booth, his successor, who so thoroughly and painstakingly analysed the data provided by the numerous Census forms and tabulated the results for incorporation in the Census Report. I also place on record my thanks to the two Enumerators, Mr. F. Wallace and Mr. T. J. Keane, both of the Police and Prisons Department, who had the arduous task of delivering the Census forms to Stanley householders and collecting them after completion.

# Report of the Census taken on the 7th December 1980

(not including the Dependencies)

#### INTRODUCTION

The Census was carried out in pursuance of the provisions of the Census Ordinance. It included the entire population of the Colony (excluding the Dependencies) at that date including visitors to the Colony, but did not include the 42 Royal Marines living at the Barracks, Moody Brook. It did, however, include one Royal Marine who was (and still is) a householder in Stanley and not living at the Barracks. Prior to the 1972 Census the practice was to exclude members of H.M. Forces in the Colony. The 1972 Census, however, include 36 Royal Marines stationed in the Colony.

The present Census also took no account of the passengers and crews of two vessels in Stanley Harbour on the Census Day. Both vessels, namely the R.R.S. "John Biscoe" and the R.R.S. "Bransfield", were making brief visits to the Colony in transit to or from the British Antarctic Territory. The Census, however, did include the three members of the crew of the M.Y. "Copious" which was operating in the Colony's waters for several months.

The total population, calculated on the above basis, was found to be 1,813. For the purpose of comparing that figure with the population figure according to the 1972 Census, allowance must be made for the 36 Royal Marines included in the earlier Census. After making such allowance the apparent change in the total population over the eight years' period is a reduction of 108. This figure, however, is not entirely satisfactory as an indicator of change in the "permanent" element of the population because it disregards such "temporary" elements as tourists and contract workers whose permanent homes are outside the Colony. Nearly all visitors to the Colony arrive by air and in 1980 there were an estimated 1,939 arrivals and 2,019 departures by air, all on the scheduled twice-weekly flights of L.A.D.E. (an Argentine airline operating in Argentina and between Argentina and the Colony). It follows that an average of approximately twenty persons arrive or depart by each flight. The majority of these persons are tourists and short-term visitors.

The data extracted from the Census forms has, as in previous Censuses, been expressed in the form of tables. The enquiries on the form were extended to obtain further information outside the scope of previous Censuses. This information has mostly been expressed in additional tables and it is believed that these new statistics will be of assistance to the Government of the Colony in formulating its future plans and policy. Information was also sought to help to establish roughly how many of the population had the "right of abode" under the United Kingdom's Immigration Act, 1971. The conclusions from this particular investigation will be made known at a later date.

No attempt is made to draw conclusions from the tables save for the following few observations —

OLDEST RESIDENT. The oldest resident was a man of 92 years of age.

- MOVEMENT OF POPULATION. After allowing for the 36 Royal Marines included in the 1972 Census, it is apparent from Table II that the population of Stanley has increased slightly whereas that of the rest of the Colony has experienced a significant diminution of population.
- OVER-EIGHTIES. There were 32 residents of eighty years of age or over, compared with 15 recorded by the 1972 Census.
- LOWEST DEATH RATE. The number of deaths in 1980 was the lowest in the Colony since 1905.
- BIRTHPLACE. Table VI shows that, as established by previous Censuses, the vast majority of the population (i.e. 91.67%) was born either in the Colony or the United Kingdom.
- NATIONALITY. Table VII confirms that the vast majority (i.e. 95.04%) of the population is British. This compares with a similar figure (96.78%) derived from the 1972 Census.

- **RELIGION.** The predominant denomination is still Church of England. There was a tendency for some persons to describe themselves as "Christian" or "Protestant" without specifying any denomination. These two categories were therefore included in Table IX although not recognised in previous Censuses.
- HOUSING ACCOMMODATION AND AMENITIES. Table X, which deals with these matters, has been extended to include tables covering "status of householder", "type of cooking fuel used", "freezer capacity", "two metre sets" (whether households possess them and, if so, how many), "four-wheel drive vehicles", "tractors" and "type of building". This information, in table form, gives a fuller indication than previously of standards of living in the different areas of the Colony and the number and quality of amenities enjoyed.
- **RESIDENCE.** The new Table XIII, tabulating the various periods of residence of residents in the different areas of the Colony, will be useful to indicate the stability of the population.
