Sir,

I am directed by the Governor to forward to you, in accordance with the request of the Lord Bishop of the Falkland Islands, the enclosed lease of the Parsonage to the Trustees of Christ Church Cathedral.

2. In forwarding this lease, I am to say that His Excellency is willing to allow the Trustees, for the benefit of their clergymen, the use, at a rental of one shilling per annum, of the land hitherto attached to the Parsonage as a paddock or garden, until the land is required by the Government, on condition that there shall be a right of way to John Street, as shown in the sketch plan annexed, and that the Government carts continue to have access to the present slip gate in the dividing fence between the Gaol and the Parsonage, the position of which is indicated by a red cross on the sketch plan.

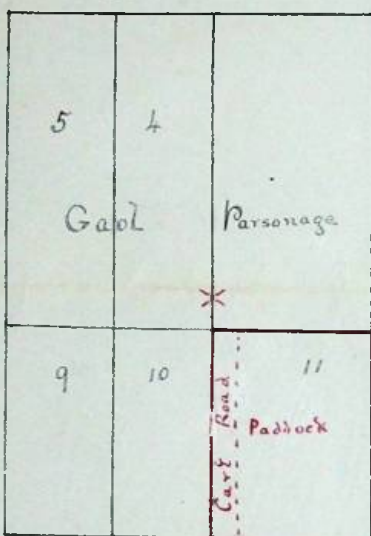
