Consecration of Cemetery, Saunders Is.

It having been represented to Us by Mr W.G. Benney the Manager of the Sheen Farm Station in the Falkland Islands group, that a piece of ground lying near and belonging to the Saunders Island Station, hitherto used as the Station Cemetery and in which some bodies are buried; had never been Consecrated; This is to certify that We, in the presence of Mr W.G. Benney and most of the members of the Station did on Tuesday April 22nd 1930, did Consecrate and for ever set apart the aforesaid piece of ground measuring 18ft by 12ft and enclosed within a well preserved wooden fence as the quiet resting place of those who shall die within the limits of the Station and others who, in the opinion of the Manager for the time being, may have a claim to be interred there.

Given at Valparaiso this Twenty Ninth Day of November in the year of Our Lord One Thousand Nine Hundred and Thirty and in the Twelfth year of our Consecration
