

Consecration of Cemetery Fox Bay.

It having been represented to Us by Mr Cobb the Manager of the Fox Bay Sheep Farm Station that there was no consecrated cemetery at the Station, and that a large piece of ground was required for the purposes of the Station, this is to certify that on Thursday April 24th 1930 we did canonically set apart and consecrate a piece of ground dimensions not specified, but marked out for the purpose of erecting a suitable fence within about a mile of the Settlement.

This piece of ground thus set apart is intended to be the quiet resting place of those who shall die within the limits of the Station and any others who, in the opinion of the Manager for the time being, may have a claim to be interred there.

Given at Valparaiso this Twenty Ninth
day of November in the year of Our Lord
One Thousand Nine Hundred and Thirty,
and in the Twelfth year of Our Consecration.
