



Letters.—Foreign.—The Rates of Postage will be found in Appendix. The dimensions allowed are 2 ft. by 1 ft.

Post Cards — Inland. — Thin 7d., thick 8d. per dozen, or singly at \(\) d. cach, either sort. Nothing whatever may appear on the front or stamped side but the addiress, nor may anything be attached to the front or back, under penalty of 1d. on delivery.

Post Cards—Foreign.—1d., 13d. and 2d. each, may be sent to all countries in the Postal Union; the rate varying according to destination.

Reply Post Cards, for use in the United Kingdom, and to most Countries in the Postal Union, are issued at double the cost of ordinary Post Cards.

Newspapers.—Registered newspapers (i.e., those which, having paid a fee of 5s. have been registered at the General Post Office for transmission at the newspaper rate) may be sent to any part of the United Kingdom at a uniform rate of \$d. each, but a packet of several is not chargenble with higher postage than the book rate of \$d. for every 2 czs. The packet must be made up without a cover, or in a cover open at ends, and so that the contents can easily be examined, be fully preputed, and contain no writing but the address. No packet may exceed 14 lbs. in weight, 2 ft. in length, or 1 ft. in width or dopth. Unregistered newspapersare subject to book post rates.

A Block Packet may consist of any number of separate books, newspapers, magazines, circulars, invoices, maps, photographs (not on glass), or prints. and any quantity of paper, vellum, or parchment, or mixture of the three, or any legitimate binding, covering, or mounting, fixed or detached, necessary either to their safe transit or naturally pertaining to them (to the exclusion of letters, or any communication of the nature of a letter), and the books, maps, paper, &c., may be printed, written, or plain. Printed Circulars, in identical terms, im yelso be sent by book post.

Book Packets — Foreign. — The regulations as to the transmission of packets to places abroad are in most cases the same as for Inland, but the limits of weight and size are not the same. The rates of postage will be found in Appendix.

Investments in Government Stocks can be made by a depositor in the Post Office Savings' Bank in sums of not less than £10, on application to the Controller of the Savings' Bank Department.

Investments are granted by the Post Office on the lives of persons of either sex, between the ages of 14 and 66, for sums of not less than £5 or more than £100; and Annuities, either Immediate or Deferred, are also granted by the Post Office of not more than £100 on the lives of persons of either sex and of the age of 5 years and upwards.

The message may be written at the office and paid for at the time, or at home on a prepaid form and be enclosed in an envelope, addressed "Telegraph Office," and posted in the nearest letter box, in which latter case the message will be tolegraphed to its destination as soon as the letter carrier takes it to the office. The above sum includes cost of delivery within one mile of the office, or beyond if within the limit of the Town postal delivery of that office.

REGISTRATION OF BIRTHS AND DEATHS.

Bierns. — The parents of every child born alive are required, under a penalty of 40s., to give to the Regis-trar of the Sub-district in which they trar of the Sub-district in which they reside, within 42 days after the birth, information of the particulars to be registered. The birth is registered free of charge at the Registrar's office, but if he attends by a written request at the bonse of the Informant, he becomes entitled to a fee of 1s. In default of the preparts the occupier of the bouse

a written request at the bonse of the Informant, he becomes entitled to a fee of 1s. In default of the parents, the occupier of the house in which the child was born, and other persons, are held responsible for giving information to the Registrar. After a lapse of 3 months from the date of birth, the registration can only be effected in the presence of the Superintendent Registrar, and on payment of fees to him and the Registrar. No birth can be registered after 12 months from date of birth without the special authority of the Registrar fooneral, and on payment of further fees.

Deaths.—Information of a death must be given within 6 days after its occurrence, by the nearest Relative of deceased present at the death or in attendance during last illness, to the Registrar of the Sub-district in which the death occurred, under a penalty of 40s, in case of omission. No fee is payable if the Informants attend at the Registrar's Office, but he becomes entitled to a fee of 1s. if he attends by request at their houses. In all cases where a registered medical man has been in attendance his certificate of the cause of death must be obtained for production to the Registrar. When no Relatives are present at the death or the occupier, or any inmate of the house in which the Many be at the information must be given to the Registrar by any Relative when may be at the time of the house in which the death occurred, or by the person who causes the body to be buried.

PASSPORTS.

A British Subject travelling on the Continent soldom needs a Passport, except in war times; but it is nevertheless advisable to carry one, as it is at all times proof of identity. A Passport is necessary for Austria, Egypt, Greece, Portngal, Russin, and Turkey, and is occasionally demanded in Germany and Spain. Travellers intending to visit Russia are advised to have their passports are issued to British-born subjects by the various British-born subjects by the various British Consuls abroad on personal application, or in London on presentation of a certificatio of Identity, signed by a Magistrate, Clergyman, Physician, Solicitor, Notary, or M.P., and countersigned by the person on whose behalf the Corkilleate is granted. Passports are Issued to naturalised British subjects only on personal application at the Foreign Office.


