- 2. I have seen applicant concerning this matter Mr. Hardy explained that he had obtained the set for the purpose of "Listening in" only and not for purely experimental purposes. When he informed Mr. Brown that he wished to use the set for experimental purposes he reakly meant that he wished to learn how to use the apparatus with a view to "listening in Mr. Hardy further stated that he had no knowledge of Wireless telegraphy and had merely obtained the set as an experiment for the purpose previously stated.
- 3. I asked the Engineer-operator to examine the appartus and to report on same. From the report attached it will be seen that the apparatus consists of the essentials for assembling a crystal receiving circuit of a primative type. Source of power is as already stated 4 leclanche cells I2 volts each/

Mr.Lash poits out that owing to the close proximity of the Stanley Station, the set would allow reception of all traffic transmitted irrespective of the wave length used for transmission.

Submitted. I saw Mr.Leslie Hardy about his application and ascertained that he proposed to convert an ordinary Wireless set into a broadcasting receiving apparatus. I do not think this would be satisfactory and Mr.Lash agrees with me.

2. The licence recently granted to the Hon.H.H.R. Cresham is for a period of three months only. This licence was really granted so that the apparatus could be properly tested. If it found that there is likely to be interference with the W/T.Station or that messages can be picked up it is unlikely that the Government will sanction a renewal of the licence.

3. I consider that Mr. Hardys application should stand over but that in any case he should supply full details of the apparatus he proposes to use.
