LIGHTING PLANT AND WIRELESS SET FOR

SAN CARLOS NORTH.

Mr.C.Andreason of San Carlos North has approached me with a view of obtaining the Governments' advice and assistance in connection with the installation of Electric Plant at San Carlos North.

It is proposed to instal a small electric plant to

- (1) Light his house
- (2) Provide power to operate a low power wireless set capable of communicating with Stanley, and
- (3) Provide power for wireless receiving apparatus for receiving broadcast programmes.

If approved authority is requested to advise Mr.Andreason and to assist him in the purchase and installation of the plant, also to give permission for the erection and operation of a wireless station on the same terms as those given to Messrs Dean Bros of Pebble Island.

I have the honour to inform you that on application made to the Superintendent of Telegraph & Telephones by Mr. W.H. Luxton, J.P., part owner and manager of the Chartres Station, West Falkland, and by Mr. W. C. Andreaesen, Manager of San Carlos North Station, East Falkland, I have authorised that department in these and in similar cases to advise and assist farmers in the Colony in the installation on their properties of electric plants for the purpose of lighting the houses and buildings at the settlements and of providing power for the operation of wireless telegraphy apparatus and for the reception of broadcast programmes.

2. I feel sure that you will be interested in developments in this connection which are taking place locally and at the same time will be glad to see an instance of the many and various ways in which under my administration this Government is endeavouring to be of real service to the public including the people of the West Falkland who as a direct result are now showing markedly monarchical tendencies in contrast to the strongly republican sentiments with which they were reputed previously to be imbued.



SCHEDULE 1.

FALKLAND ISLANDS.

THE WIRELESS TELEGRAPHY ORDINANCE, 1925.

LICENCE to establish a Wireless Telegraphy Station in the Colony.

THE ESTATE W. KEITH CAMERON,

of San Carlos North, East Falkland,

is hereby granted a Licence, subject in all respects to the provisions of the Wireless Telegraphy Ordinance, 1925, and of the Regulations made thereunder, and to the conditions herein specified, to establish, maintain and work a Wireless Telegraphy station at

San Carlos North

for the purpose of private business.

In this Licence where the context so admits or requires the term "wireless telegraphy" includes wireless telephony.

This Licence is valid for the period ~~one year~~ ^{seven months} ending on the 31st day of December, 1929, and is liable to modification, suspension, or cancellation at any time by notice in writing from the Colonial Secretary.

The Licensee shall pay to the Colonial Treasurer the sum of ~~one pound~~ ^{Eleven shillings & Eightpence} on the grant of this Licence.

GENERAL CONDITIONS.

1. The apparatus to be used shall be as specified in the Schedule hereto and shall not be altered without the permission in writing the Colonial Secretary.
2. The station shall not be worked for any purpose other than that specified herein.
3. The station shall be worked in such a way as not to interfere with naval signalling or with the working of any other station lawfully established in the Colony or in the territorial waters thereof.
4. The station shall be open at all reasonable times to inspection by the Superintendent of Telegraphs and Telephones or by any person duly authorised by him.
5. The Licensee shall not divulge or allow to be divulged to any person other than a duly authorised officer of the Government of the Colony, or to a competent legal tribunal, or make any use whatsoever of any messages received by means of the station other than in pursuance of the purpose for which the Licence is granted.
6. The Licensee shall give all possible assistance to the Government of the Colony when required in any matter of public business.


