- (1) I do not think that the Supt of T+T' solution to this problem is a workable one.
- (2) at the present time the Hall is booked nightly for reheareds, band practices and dances from 4.0 pm to 10.0 pm
- I think it quite unworkable to keep the Town Hall locked, unless a door keeper is kept, and I submit this expense is unwarranted.
  - (4) I also submit that provided seeds of Depte take reasonable case, there is no need to incur unnecessary expense, in fitting new bolts and locks to the doors.
  - (5) I submit that any trouble in the Lown Hall is caused by unauthorized persons entering the Hall, and not by persons who have legitomate business to attend to.
  - (6) The locks on the doors are of good quality, but no lock in the world will stand against a skeleton key.
  - I submit that all keys whether for inner or outer doors should be called in, and returned to the Colonial Engineers office for registration, I will then see that no unauthorized person is issued a master key.
  - (8) I have for some time been uneasy about the keys

of the Town Hall, as I have had it reported to me, that the Super of To T has had office keys converted to skeleton keys, and that members of his staff are also in possession of these keys. I submit that this is entirely wrong as they are likely to get into the wrong peoples hands.

I have called the attention of the Supt To T to this matter before, but have been unable to get definite information on the subject.

I submit that the calling in of all keys, and the destruction of any skeleton keys, should be carried out at once.
