Mr Perry of the Stanley Arms has approached me with a view to obtaining H.E.'s authority to erect a line between his house and that of Mr. Les Hardy for the purpose of connecting a loudspeaker to Mr. Hardy's radio set. Under the Telephone Regs. nobody is permitted to erect an electric wire without special permission of the Governor.

It is submitted that if permission is given that the following reservations are necessary.

- (1) That it does not interfere with any Government Service.
(Telephones, Telegraphs, Electric Light or B'casting)
- (2) That all reasonable precautions are taken to ensure Public Safety from fire or shock etc.
- (3) That the line cannot be used for the interception of telephone conversations.
- (4) That it can be inspected at any reasonable hour by a duly authorized officer of the Government.
- (5) That it is not unsightly from the Public Highway.


