

Sir,

In accordance with your instructions I beg to report that the reception of press from the Rugby shortwave transmitter at 0200 GMT has at fairly frequent intervals been very difficult owing to interference caused by a pure continuous wave station transmitting on the same wavelength as Rugby GBC. Since the stations call signal has not yet been heard it is impossible to say exactly where or what the station is.

Interference during the press period has not been so noticeable during the past week.
