BROADCAST SERVICE.

INTERFERENCE WITH BROADCAST SERVICE BY  
PRIVATE WIRELESS SETS.

-----

We regret to call attention to the fact that considerable interference with the reception at the Stanley Studio of wireless programmes from London and overseas has been caused recently by the oscillation of aerials belonging to privately owned sets. We are ready to believe that this interference is involuntary but at the same time we ask those offending to appreciate the difficulty thus created to the Studio Staff and the disappointment thus occasioned to the large number of their fellow townsmen and listeners-in in Stanley.

We request earnestly the owners of private sets not to spoil the pleasure of others in this manner, and we are authorised also to remind them of the conditions under which they hold their licences from the Government which state expressly that

"The station shall not be used in such a way as to cause interference with the working of other stations. In particular, valves must not be connected in such a manner as to be capable of causing the aerial to oscillate".
