Broadcasting during Summer months

As our Broadcasting apparatus is now working from the electric light mains the question of hours for Broadcasting during the Summer months must be considered.

The following proposals are submitted for your consideration:-

- (1) It is proposed to discontinue the usual childrens corner after Saturday the 3rd of October and to substitute instead a childrens corner every Saturday commencing at 7.p.m. X
- (2) Sunday evening programme to remain unchanged.
- (3) Programmes which now commence at 8.p.m. continuing to 10.p.m. to be gradually put back to 9.p.m. continuing to 10-30.p.m.

It is anticipated that this alteration will not be required until the middle of October, when programmes may for instance commence at 8-30.p.m. and at the end of October commence at 9.p.m.

As the hours of daylight are increasing I would be glad to receive your instructions as to whether the electric generator is to be kept running from 4.30 pm daily for the purpose of relaying the London Empire news. This news is not used for the 'Penguin', and as the same bulletin is transmitted at a later hour I see no use in keeping the generator running, or rather in running the generator up while there is plenty of daylight. The cost of running up the plant with little or no load will prove expensive if practised daily. Fuel and oil will be approximately five shillings per hour, but the engine will be erratic in its governing through having little or no load
