

As the hours of daylight are increasing I would be glad to receive your instructions as to whether the electric generator is to be kept running from 4.30 pm daily for the purpose of relaying the London Empire news. This news is not used for the 'Penguin', and as the same bulletin is transmitted at a later hour I see no use in keeping the generator running, or rather in running the generator up while there in plenty of daylight. The cost of running up the plant with little or no load will prove expensive if practised daily. Fuel and oil will be approximately five shillings per hour, but the engine will be erratic in its governing through having little or no load
