The Broadcasting System requires some reorganisation. At present we have one announcer who is also the clerk in the Dept. Other members of the Dept have assisted for some time by taking a Sunday evening in turn. but, this led to the person concerned taking or being given equivalent time off work the following morning, an arrangement which has not given satisfaction. owing to the amount of work always on hand.

I propose therefore, with your approval, to employ two persons already in the dept to do the Broadcasting independently from their normal duties and to pay each the sum of £3 per month instead of the one person at £4.10 per month.
