EXCERPT PRON MINUTE FROM SUP. E. & T. DATED 6th NOV., 1945 (Original filed in M.P. 66/35)

The Morwegian authority at Bergen Radio has asked whether we can resume communication with Bergenradio LCM and if on the same terms as before the war. Bergen is anxious to start traffic as soon as possible.

On receipt of the above I approached the Maval authorities and so far some twelve days have clapsed with no indication that the service will be resumed. The Whaling season is starting and Revenue derived before the war was considerable and I presume will not be less now. In addition to working Bergen there will be Morwegian ships to attend to as well.

In the meantime Bergen is still awaiting our reply. Is it possible to authorise South Georgia to work Bergen and ships pending a favourable reply from the Admiralty, or a decision is reached about the Govt. establishing their own commercial station.


