

Proposed Constitution for the Broadcast Advisory <u>Committee</u>

- 1. The duty of the Committee shall be to advise the Director of Broadcasting on the content of broadcast programmes.
- 2. It shall consist of six members appointed by the Governor together with a Chairman.
- 3. The Director of Broadcasting shall not be among the six members above and shall be ex-officio Chairman of the Committee.
- 4. Each member, excluding the Chairman, shall be appointed for a period of two years and shall not be eligible to serve again until at least a further year has passed.
- 5. In order to enable Rule 3 to come into force a ballot shall be taken during December, 1955, at which three of the present six members will draw blanks and be required to resign. The remaining members will continue for a further year and three new members will be appointed.
- 6. The Secretary shall not, as long as the post remains a salaried one, be a member of the Committee and shall not have a vote.






