I am to inform you that His Excellency the Governor has directed that you should be invited to accept the posts of Director of Broadcasting, Falkland Islands, and Chairman of the Broadcasting Advisory Committee.

## 2. As Director of Broadcasting:-

- (a) You would be responsible for all programmes broadcast from the Falkland Islands Broadcasting Station at Stanley;

- (e) You would be expected to attach particular importance to improving the value and interest of News Broadcasts and to ensure that the news readers confine themselves to news and general comment and do not express their personal views on controversial topics;
- (f) You would be advised on the contents of broadcast programmes by the Broadcasting Advisory Committee. If on account of these general directions and terms of reference you consider it necessary to overrule the recommendations of the Broadcasting Advisory Committee in any important matter of policy, you would be required to inform His Excellency the Governor accordingly and to state your reasons for overruling the Committee or acting contrary to its advice;
- (g) You would be required to ensure that your approval is obtained before the Broadcasting Committee incurs any expenditure on broadcasting materials for which provision is made in the estimates.

3. Finally, I am to say that Government appreciates the fact, to which you drew attention in your Confidential Note of the 13th of April, 1955, that you are at present teaching all day, that much additional work is involved with the new Schools at Stanley and Darwin and that work connected with the Central Film Library is expanding. Nevertheless I am to express the hope that you will find it possible to accept this additional and very important commitment.

4. If you decide to accept these posts, you are requested to advise this office accordingly and the necessary steps will then be taken to gazette the appointment and to inform the Secretary of the Broadcasting Advisory Committee.

Proposed Constitution for the Broadcast Advisory  
Committee

1. The duty of the Committee shall be to advise the Director of Broadcasting on the content of broadcast programmes.
2. It shall consist of six members appointed by the Governor together with a Chairman.
3. The Director of Broadcasting shall not be among the six members above and shall be ex-officio Chairman of the Committee.
4. Each member, excluding the Chairman, shall be appointed for a period of two years and shall not be eligible to serve again until at least a further year has passed.
5. In order to enable Rule 3 to come into force a ballot shall be taken during December, 1955, at which three of the present six members will draw blanks and be required to resign. The remaining members will continue for a further year and three new members will be appointed.
6. The Secretary shall not, as long as the post remains a salaried one, be a member of the Committee and shall not have a vote.

I have, through the Superintendent of Posts and Telegraphs, received your resignation from the post of Secretary to the Broadcasting Department.

As you yourself are aware the broadcasting service plays a most important and integral part of the life of our community in the Falkland Islands and the fact that it does so, and does so efficiently, is very largely due to the great personal interest you have taken in broadcasting, to your unfailing patience, and to your efficiency. We shall have the greatest difficulty in finding somebody with those essential qualifications which you yourself have brought to the task.

Finally, may I say that there is widespread and universal regret at your departure and that of your husband, and you will leave the Falkland Islands with the affection, good will and good wishes of everyone in the community.

May I add the personal good wishes to you both of my wife and myself.



I have been advised by the Director of Broadcasting that following recent discussions on the subject of the appointment of a Broadcasting Secretary to succeed you and after considering replies submitted in response to an advertisement, the Broadcasting Advisory Committee have put forward two names for the post. I understand that in order of priority they are:-

- (1) Mr. R. S. Moss.
- (2) Mrs. G. A. Cahill.

I have very carefully considered the recommendations of the Committee against the background of what Government considers to be the necessary qualifications for the post. As your Committee are already aware, Government considers it important that whoever takes the post should have sufficient time to devote to the duties involved and should, in addition, be readily available to the general public. I feel that Mr. Moss would undertake the duties of Broadcasting Secretary, or Programme Secretary as it is now to be called, very competently but he already holds a full time post and would quite clearly only be available at some time after 5.0.p.m. each day. I do not consider that in such circumstances he would be as easily available for daytime duties in connexion with the post as is desirable and necessary.

In these circumstances I propose to accept the second and alternative recommendation of the Committee and appoint Mrs. G. A. Cahill to be the new Programme Secretary.
