MEMORANDUM NO. 85/66 FOR EXECUTIVE COUNCIL

R/T Licence, Falkland Islands Co., Ltd.

An application has been received from the Falkland Islands Co., Ltd. for a wireless licence for the purpose of operating R/T equipment between the Company's installations at Stanley, Port Stephens, Fox Bay West, Darwin/Goose Green, North Arm, Speedwell Island and Fitzroy. The equipment that the Company propose to install is Single Side Band Transceivers, Model 3SB1 produced by the Radio Corporation of America. Communication would be confined to passing the Company's business.

This application means, in effect, the by-passing of Stanley R/T control and the W/T Station and a small loss of revenue, estimated at £25 per annum, would occur.

At present all F.I.C. farm stations can communicate by R/T with each other under their existing licences, but none can communicate with the head office in Stanley. The proposed arrangement would be of considerable convenience to the Company.

The Postmaster, as Officer in Charge of the Posts and Telecommunications Department for the time being, doubts whether private wireless circuits should be encouraged but admits that the use of the side band type of transmitter and receiver provides the privacy that the Government network cannot provide unless it also changes the type of equipment in use.

The Falkland Islands Company is prepared to operate these new sets on any frequency allocated by Government: this would ensure that there was no interference with the services at present provided on 4.5 and 2 megacycles but it would probably require an application to the International Frequency Board for a further allocation. No action has been taken in this respect for the proper sequence of action seems to be that approval in principle to the granting of a licence should first be obtained.

Council is asked to consider and advise.

Ref:615. Government do provide a Radio Telephone Service to the farms concerned and I don't think we should encourage private wireless circuits. Admittedly our service is on the open network and all conversations virtually become public knowledge!! The service suggested by FIC would have far greater privacy. The use of SSB or similar sets would of course be a step forward in so far as the R/T service is concerned. Other ~~camp~~ stations, may at a later date, wish to change to SSB and Government could possibly be committed financially.

The sets in question are primary designed for use in the Maritime Service and the present frequencies are not suitable for use locally. The only frequencies we can allocate for inland services are 4.5 and 2 megacycles. Use of SSB on these frequencies, especially the S.S.B.1. with its higher power, would seriously disrupt our present R/T service. If, and before a licence is approved, FIC should furnish particulars of the frequencies they wish to use. We would then have to make application to the International Frequency Board for allocation to this territory.

The estimated loss of revenue, based on ~~the~~ 1965 figures, would amount to about £25 per year, if FIC traffic was withdrawn for the present R/T and W/T services.

No additional revenue would be forthcoming from extra Licence Fees etc. The present licences, issued to Port Stephens, Fox Bay etc. for use on 4.5 and 2 mcs, would I assume, only need amending.

Perhaps you would agree to amend or discontinue the broadcasts?






With reference to recent discussions regarding the above communications equipment, we wish, if possible, to make the following arrangements :-

1. Six of these sets will be allocated to Company's farms.
2. One set will be allocated for R.M.S. "Darwin".
3. One set will be retained in Stanley Office.
4. Each set can operate on four different frequencies and we would like to use the two lower frequencies, e.g. 3 and 4 megacycles, for communication between Stanley Office and Camp stations. We would also like to be able to use these same two frequencies plus two higher frequencies in the 8 and 12 megacycle bands for communication between the office and R.M.S. "Darwin".

To allow the above arrangements it will be necessary to have a dispensation allowing the "Darwin" to use shore station frequencies, or alternatively, to allow Stanley Office to use ships frequencies, and we understand that provision is made for this in the I.T.U. regulations. The sets in question are rated at 150 watts, but this of course can be reduced if you so wish. As you know, two sets have been in use for some time now using 3.203 megacycles, 4.0759 megacycles, 8.2055 megacycles and 12.3958 megacycles. So far we have not heard any voice transmissions on any of these frequencies and only occasionally have we heard morse transmissions.

We would be grateful for an opportunity to discuss the above as soon as possible.

Pole-Evans of Saunders Island, a local amateur radio enthusiast and have applied through him for permission to operate amateur radio equipment during their visit.

2. We follow U.K. practice in the matter of issuing amateur radio licences to alien. Reciprocal arrangements exist for licensing aliens from a number of foreign countries but Brazil is not one. Your file 0647/III refers.

3. The purpose of this Memorandum is to seek advice on what action should be taken with regard to the applications. There are as I see it, two courses open:
