Prospective entrants are requested, however, to be as exact as possible in their estimate of provisional entries with the view more especially to facilitating the consideration of the transport arrangements which will be required.

We are duly in receipt of your letter of June 20th., with enclosure, for which we thank you and we shall have much pleasure in assisting you to find a judge for the sheep sections of the forthcoming Centenary Stock Show.

In this connection, we cannot do better than recommend to you Mr. Tom C. Norris, a gentleman with many years experience of sheep-farming in Australia and in this country, and who was, until recently, General Manager of the Argentine Southern Land Company. 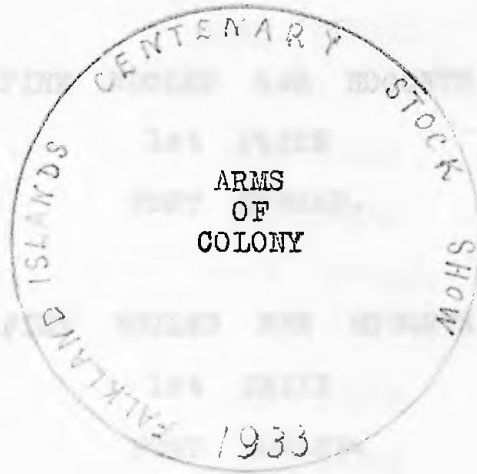

Report on the Centenary Stock Show.

—::O::—

At a meeting of the Centenary Committee it was decided to hold a stock show during Centenary Week. A stock show sub-committee was formed with the Colonial Secretary as chairman. This committee, representative of the East and West Islands and of Stanley, was responsible for the organisation of the show. The difficulties of communication prevented full and frequent meetings of the committee but the final arrangements proved adequate. The committee decided to hold, in conjunction with the show, sheep-dog trials and these were run off on the afternoon of the show day.

The show was held on the 14th of February, 1933, in the Quarantine Station at Stanley. There was a good entry in the sheep and horse classes but in the class for dairy cows the entry was disappointing.

The gates were opened to the public at 9 a.m., when judging commenced. The Judge, Mr. Tom C. Norris of Buenos Aires, proved to be very popular and painstaking and carried out his duties in a most thorough manner. The judging, which was carried out in public, was at once interesting and instructive.

There were two main classes of sheep entries; one for fine woolled, the other for medium woolled sheep. As expected, there were few entries in the fine woolled class, but a representative number of entries was received in the medium woolled class. The competition in the latter class was keen and the awards were well divided amongst the exhibitors. The lamb and mutton sections were also large and here again the competition was keen. Messrs J. L. Waldron, Ltd. of Port Howard, West Falkland, won the championship cups for the best ram and best ewe at the show. Nine first prize awards also went to Port Howard.

The judge commented very favourably on the exhibits. In an interview Mr. Norris made the following remarks:-

"I think the winning sheep extremely good; a very nice type of a commercial class of animal, with a good frame and heavy fleece of high class wool; a very compact sheep, deep, broad and shapely with a masculine appearance about him. The wool is of medium strength, well marked and nice feel. Altogether he is a credit to the establishment where he was bred.

"The champion ewe is a similar type of sheep; also compact and broad, standing squarely, very well covered with a heavy fleece of nice feel.

"In both sheep the charm was the way the wool opened. There was nothing matted or fuzzy and the quality was carried right up to the tips.

"I should consider that Camp which is producing stock of the quality of these exhibits should be quite capable of producing a wool which can successfully compete in the markets of the world with the best wools of most other sheep-breeding countries *i.e.* of course, when the quality which is now evident in these picked animals has been established right through the ordinary breeding flocks, for the value of a wool clip is not governed by the merits of the few selected animals but rather by the general quality of the whole flock.

"I first saw Falkland Islands wool at the London Sales in 1906 and the quality of what I have seen at this local exhibition is evidence of an extraordinary amount of progress having been effected since that time.

"As regards the lambs, they are, of course, too small as yet to be able to make any definite classification as to their real quality and the only system on which I could operate was by selecting those showing the most robust development with the broadest backs and deepest conformation, combined with the feel and marking of the little amount of wool they were carrying.

Altogether I think the Colony should be proud of the fact that the sheep-farmers are producing animals of such good quality as those in the exhibition."

At 11 a.m. His Excellency the Governor arrived at the show ground and took great interest in the exhibits. At 11-30 a.m. the parade of cart and riding horses took place. This parade evoked much interest from the public as some excellent examples of Falkland Islands horse gear were on view and some splendid types of Falkland Islands bred horses paraded. Mr. J. Robertson assisted Mr. Norris at the judging of these classes. Mr. G. Goddard and the Veterinary Officer judged the dairy cows.

It had been decided to hold a sale by auction after the show but as no buyers came forward the auction was cancelled.

The success of the show was largely dependent on the transport facilities. The difficulties of transport in the Colony were surmounted by the excellent arrangements made by the Falkland Islands Company whose vessel, the s.s. Lafonia, made several voyages and called at all the main ports. The s.s. Fleurus also made special voyages.

The course for the sheep-dog trials was laid out in the Government paddocks and was designed to conform, as far as possible, with normal working conditions. The spectators arranged themselves outside the paddock fences on the common where a good view of the course could be obtained. There were sixteen entries. The judges were the Hon. G. J. Felton, Mr. R. C. Pole-Evans, Mr. Tom C. Norris and the Veterinary Officer. Most of the dogs accustomed to working in the vastness of the camp were not seen at their best working in the small paddocks with houses adjacent to the course. Mr. S. Miller won with 'Speed' and Mr. Hall was runner-up. The competitors were agreed that the course was a good test, although no dog completed the course. Several competitors were unlucky with their lot of sheep with the result that the standard of work was below that expected. The judges were of the opinion that the most apparent weaknesses were those of driving and command.

That the show proved a success may be judged from the fact that it was the wish of most of the exhibitors that a similar show might be held every three years.






