EXTRACTS FROM A LETTER RECEIVED FROM THE COLMODORE.

H.M.S. DURBAN, THE ORIGINAL OF WHICH IS FILED IN M.P.

412/30. (red 79) AND DATED 8TH DECEMBER, 1932.

Para. 2. With regard to the details of your programme the only important proposal I have to make is that there should be a ceremonial opening to the centenary Week, and that this should take the form of a simple review by Your Excellency of the Falkland Islands Defence Force and Maval and Royal Marine detachment and Band from H.M.S. Dauntless' under arms on the Football Ground before Church on Sunday, 12th February.

I enclose a proposed plan for this, drawn up in consultation with the Officer Commanding the Falkland Islands Defence Force.

Para. 6. I should be grateful if you would inform 'Dauntless' in due course how many of her men are expected at the Commemoration Service on Sunday, 12th February. The Naval and Marine detachments paraded for the Review would total about one hundred, but I suggest that not half of these should attend Church, so as to leave sufficient accommodation for the civilian community.

Two Naval and one Marine platoons (each of 24 men) and Royal Marine band from H.M.S. "Dauntless".

Three platoons and Colour party from Falkland Islands Defence Force.


