Minute from Hon. Treasurer, Library and Museum Committee, d/24/1/22.....

Submitted.

I beg to recommend that the grant be increased by £10 provided that the Committee is able to make acceptable arrangements for supplying West Falkland with books ^{from present stocks} to a value of not less than £10 in addition. The latter sum to be handed over to the Committee when the supply has been effected. The original grant of books which would be made without charge to the W. F. farmers and shepherds would form a nucleus for a library to be kept at Fox Bay by the Government office stationed there, and £10 a year thereafter could be granted provided that subscriptions to

not less than an equivalent amount to
bead raised ^{annually} by the West Falklands.

3. The only correspondence which I have
been able to find on the subject of a library
for West Falkland is that in ref. 486
but I understand that there was verbal
or written correspondence on the subject last
year.

4. If the above proposal is approved the
W. F. representatives might be asked to elect
their own library Committee of which the
Government officer at Ine Bay should be
a member.

5. A balance of £ 5 will then be left
on the vote which can be set aside for
unforeseen contingencies.

2. At a meeting with Mr. S. Miller, Mr. P. Evans,
Mr. Lester, Mr. Penney, Mr. M. Robson, & Mr. Sam Bennett
in Dec. of last year we discussed arrangements
for a library at Ine Bay & for supply of
Books from Stanley. I stated that I was prepared,
if necessary, to visit the Leg. Co. to sanction
the expenditure of a small sum for a library
in West Falkland but suggested that the Library

Committee should be approached with the object of coming to some practical arrangement for the supply of books. I understood that some arrangement had been made but I see that is not the case. There was nothing in writing but about explain what took place

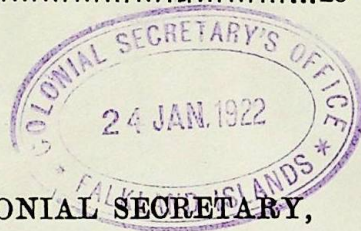

Hon. Col. Secty,

I am directed by the Committee to ask whether the Govt. grant to the library and museum in respect of the year 1922 can now be made. It is noted that a sum of £125 is provided under item 2 of Head & XV. Miscellaneous of which sum £50 p.a. is paid to the Library and Museum attendant leaving a balance of £75. Formerly the amount of the Govt. Grant was £50 p.a., but the Committee now ask that the sum of £75 be granted. Cost of setting up birds (286-15-9) and cost of postage a/c and renewal of subscription for periodicals &c., has reduced the Funds of the Library & Museum to only a few pounds.

Sir,

With reference to your minute of the 24th of January, I am directed by the Governor to inform you that His Excellency is prepared to authorize an increase of £10 in the annual grant to the Public Library and Museum provided that the Committee is able to make acceptable arrangements for supplying books from present stocks to form a nucleus of a library on the West Falkland Island. The value of the books supplied should be not less than £10 and payment of the latter sum will be made separate and apart from the increase in the grant when the supply of books has been effected.
