2. On another w.p. which cannot I regret to say be traced at this moment Y.S. was pleased to ~~advise~~ ~~that~~ approve of the supply for a West Falkland Library of £10 worth of books. This was to form the nucleus of a library which should be under the care of the Wireless Operator at Fore Bay. Mr. Miller who has been one of the leading movers among the W. F. Farmers for ^{the proposal for} supplying library books from the Public Library expressed pleasure at the proposal that they should have a library of their own. This has been rendered possible by the grant of an additional £10 to the Public Library.

3. The Committee of the Public Library were unanimously in favour of the proposed arrangement and the feeling was that it should be of an annual nature.

4. Messrs. Hethell, Hamilton and myself selected 140 books which are ready for despatch to the West by the

Falkland Horns. Many of
the books selected were duplicates of
copies remaining but the W. F. Library
cannot expect to have any thing
approaching the same number of
books in future years for £10. That
was approximately the amount the
books would have fetched at an auction
sale but ^{the books} may I think be considered
a generous grant.

5. I submit a draft of the

the W. F. Farmers containing detailed
proposals.

CIRCULAR.

Sir,

With reference to past correspondence on the subject of the provision of books from the Public Library for the use of residents in the West Falkland, I am directed by the Governor to inform you that His Excellency has been pleased to approve of an alternative proposal, detailed below, for the formation of a West Falkland Library.

2. In consideration of an additional grant of £10 from Government to the Committee of the Public Library 140 books have been selected by the Committee from the Public Library to form a nucleus for a West Falkland Library. These books are being despatched by the s.s. "Falkland" to Fox Bay where they will be under the charge of the Wireless Operator who will, it is proposed, act as Honorary Librarian.

3. It is suggested that the residents of the West Falkland should form their own Library Committee to determine the arrangements for the management of the Library and fix such subscriptions for membership as may seem suitable.

4. The Committee of the Public Library will be glad to act as agents for the West Falkland Library by ordering books or papers on its behalf and will be glad to cooperate in any other manner that may be acceptable.

5. It is not proposed that the above arrangements should interfere with the right of individual residents of the West Falkland to subscribe separately to the Public Library but in view of the inconvenience caused owing to lack of communication by the length of time during which books supplied to the West are necessarily kept out, it is hoped that the West Falkland Library may in time suffice to fill all the needs of residents.

6. The Governor trusts that the action which has been taken and the proposal put forward will meet with the concurrence of residents in the West Island. I am to add that it may be found possible for Government to make an annual grant from public funds from 1923 onwards of £10 towards the West Falkland Library. This could be expended either in books from the Public Library or in new orders, but it is expected that the new Library should be mainly self-supporting.

Sir,

With reference to the formation of a West Falklands Library, I have the honour to report for the information of His Excellency the Governor, that, at a meeting of a number of West Falkland managers held at Fox Bay on the 12th. August last, it was unanimously agreed to at once open a West Falkland Islands Lending Library at Fox Bay with the 140 books kindly supplied by the Committee of the Public Library at Stanley, and in accordance with the suggestions set forth in your Circular Letter dated 25th. July, 1922. A Library Committee was accordingly formed, and Provisional Rules drawn up, a copy of which I beg to enclose herewith.

2. I have to thank you for the trouble you have taken in this matter, and would beg to add for your information that I personally attended to the starting of the Library on a good working basis; and to insure the success of this very excellent movement, it now remains for the members of the committee and other station managers to see that the Library Rules are strictly adhered to, and at the same time to grant every facility to their employees to send and receive books.

3. The first order for new books - amounting to £6:-5:-0 - was sent to the Times Book Club towards the end of last year.

4. I regret the delay in writing, but was under the impression that this had already been done.

RULES.

- 1 Any resident on the West Falkland Islands may, on application, to the ~~Manager~~ Honorary Librarian (Wireless Operator), and on payment of a YEARLY SUBSCRIPTION OF FIVE SHILLINGS (5/-), borrow and take out the following books at a time.
- 2 Members resident at Fox Bay one book (2 vols.) at a time: Members resident on Outside Stations - if four members - 12 books; under 4 members - 6 books.
- 3 Every book shall be returned by the very first available opportunity after being read - Fox Bay Members no longer than two weeks: Outside Members:- under no condition must a book or books be retained by them for a longer period than three months.
- 4 No book shall be lent or passed on from a member to another person who is not a subscriber to the Library.
- 5 The loss or damage of any book shall be reported and payment to the value thereof, not under a sum of 2/6, made to the Librarian.
