



Sir,

I have the honour to submit the attached letter from Mrs. Vaughan on the subject of the Library and Museum Committee.

2. I think Mrs. Vaughan takes an exaggerated view of the changes made last year while she was away. As regards the Library (which is of much greater importance - or at any rate of much more general interest - than the Museum) none of the Committee's recommendations has been disapproved or even questioned, and in fact the Government has not been informed of the details of expenditure but has merely been asked to authorise a stated sum when required. This is the strongest possible proof of confidence in the Committee, that the Government, after taking steps to ensure that all details of proposed expenditure shall be supplied if required, have been content to approve expenditure when requested without asking for any details whatever.

3. As regards the Museum I am inclined to think that it would be better if that institution were not managed by a Committee at all. There is no need for representative management for a Museum. It is, or should be, a purely Government institution which might well be part of the Government Naturalist's Department, in which case its upkeep and requirements would be altogether under Government control. I take it that the Government Naturalist is already in fact, though not specifically so called, the Curator of the Museum.



#### (11th July, 1918.)

An Ordinance to provide for the care and management of a Public Library and Museum in the Town of Stanley.

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of the Falkland Islands, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:---

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Library and Museum Ordinance, 1918.

2. The Library and Museum established in the rooms set apart for the purpose in the Government Building known as the "Town Hall", in the Town of Stanley, shall be called the Public Library and Museum, and shall be maintained out of such moneys as may be provided by the Legislative Council and approved by the Secretary of State, and such other moneys as may be subscribed or received for the purpose.

**6.** (1) Admission to the Library and Museum shall be free of charge.

(2) Subject to such limitations and conditions as may be imposed by the rules, every one of the community may enjoy the use of the Library during such time as the Library is open, and being a subscriber to the Library may borrow and take books. papers, magazines, etc., out of the Library in accordance with the Rules.

Legal proceedings may be taken on behalf of the Committee.

(2) On the occurrence of a vacancy by the death, absence from the Colony, or resignation of any member, the Governor may make a fresh appointment to the Committee.

4. (1) The Committee may make and from time to time vary or annul rules for the general care and management of the Library and Museum and the conditions under which books, papers, magazines, etc. may be borrowed and taken out of the Library. All rules made by the Committee shall be submitted to the Governor, and shall come into force and take effect as and when approved by the Governor in Council and published in the Gazette.

(2) The rules may provide for a penalty not exceeding twenty shillings for any breach thereof, and for the payment of the amount of any damage done to the Library or to the Museum or anything contained therein.

The Governor may appoint a Librarian and Museum 5. (1) attendant who shall receive such salary as the Legislative Council may provide and as may be approved by the Secretary of State.



no revenue from admission fees, none being charged. The museum has been visited by many distinguished people passing through the Colony and has been highly spoken of both as regards its contents and the way they are kept. Enclosure C is a list of the principal birds in the museum.

I would mention that after the bird case is installed we estimate an expenditure of nearly 2400 to replace the other cases, the present fittings being made of pitch pine or varnished deal. All new cases would of course be obtained from England.

The committee of the Public Museum and Library of Stanley have had their attention drawn to a paragraph in the "Museum News"-the publication of the American Associati-n of Museums, Washington, U.S.A. January 1st 1934, p 2, in which it is stated that a sum of \$ 63,000 has been placed in your hands to serve as grants in aid to museums in the British Colonies."

I would beg to put forward the claims of our museum to your consideration when disbursement takes place. In doing so it is as well to make it clear the position of this museum. The collection is publicarky owned, and is housed by the Government in one large room in the Town Hall, free of charge for rent, light, or cleaning: while care, arrangement, etc is done without charge. The museum consists of a local collection, the geology, birds, and flora are particularly good and well represented; except for the mollusca the invertebrates are not so well represented, but the museum has the promise of a good collection at present being made by R.R.S "Discovery". Exhibits referring to whaling, ancient and modern, are shown as far as space permits. Some space is devoted, and many good specimens shown of the now almost extinct people of the Cape Horn area. aborigines in which the Colony formerly had some missionary interest. Some non local specimens are on view, but these are being discarded as local exhibits become available.

The museum is open free of charge twice weekly, and at any time to visitors and passengers in transit through the Port.There are no funds in the strict sense.The Museum and Library are run jointly, and the former, to some extent, assists itself by a charge on books loaned.The Government



make an annual grant in aid of £100.This small sum just suffices to keep the more popular library in moderately good condition, if strict ecomomy is practiced, since any expenditure on the museum implies a corresponding reduction in the sum available for the library.

The most pressing needs of the museum are a new wall case to house the excellent collection of birds, and material to construct(locally) table and wall cases to replace the rather rough and inconvenient furniture at present in use.

The single bird case is already overcrowded to exclusion, having answered its purpose for 25 years, it is moreover unsuitable as regards lighting, and the exclusion of dust is almost impossible. All the rest of the furniture has similar faults. We had an estimate for the large bird case we most need, some time ago, and learned that the entire cost would be about £200, this is far in excess of any sum at the disposal of the commottee. Replacement of the remain--der of the furniture is less pressing, some of it could be made locally, thus saving considerably on freight of built up materials if money were available for purchase. Thanking you in anticipation of a favourable review of our particular position.





To provide for the care and management of the Public Library and Museum in the Town of Stanley.

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of the Falkland Islands with the advice and consent of the Legislative 

This Ordinance may be cited as the Public Library and Short Title. 1. Museum Ordinance, 1944.

Maintenance.

2. The library and museum established in the rooms set apart for the purpose in the government building known as the Town Hall, Stanley, shall be called The Public Library and Museum. and shall be maintained out of such moneys as may be provided by the Legislative Council, and such other moneys as may be subscribed or received for the purpose.

3. (1) The Public Library and Museum shall be under the care and management of a committee of five persons to be appointed by the Governor.

(2) Two members of the committee shall retire annually but shall be eligible for re-appointment. The retirements shall be in the order of their appointment as gazetted and shall include the Chairman.

(3) On the occurrence of a vacancy by the death, absence from the Colony, or resignation of any member the Governor may make an appointment to fill the vacancy.

(4) The Governor shall appoint a member of the committee to be Chairman.

4

4. (1) The committee may from time to time make, vary or revoke rules for the general care and management of the library and museum and for the conditions under which books, papers, magazines, and other publications may be borrowed and taken out of the library.

(2) The rules may provide for a penalty not exceeding -tyenty shillings for any breach of them, and for the payment of compensation for any damage done to the library or to the museum or canything contained in them.

(3) Legal proceedings under this Ordinance shall be brought in the name of the Committee and all penalties imposed by the rules and compensation for any damage may be recovered summarily.

5. Fines and sums received by reason of any proceedings under this Ordinance shall be credited to the Public Library and Museum and shall be applied to its uses.

6. (1) The Governor may appoint a library and museum Attendant who shall receive such salary as the Governor may prescribe.

(2) The Attendant shall act under the direction of the Committee and in accordance with the rules, and shall be responsible for and have immediate charge of the library and museum and everything contained therein.

7. (1) Admission to the Public Library and Museum shall Admission free. be free of charge.

Fines &c. to be credited to Public Library and Museum funds.

(2) Subject to the provisions of the rules, every one of the community may enjoy the use of the library and visit the museum.

### A Bill

To enable the Governor in Council to make regulations with regard to the importation of plants with a view to the prevention of the introduction and spread of pests and diseases affecting vegetation and for purposes connected therewith.

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of the Falkland Islands, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof as follows :-

Short title and application.

Definitions.

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Plant Disease Regulation Ordinance, 1944 and shall apply to the Falkland Islands and Dependencies.

2. In this Ordinance unless the context otherwise requires -

"plant" includes everything in the nature of a plant, and the flowers, fruits, leaves, cuttings, bark, timber, and any part thereof whatsoever, whether living or dead, severed or attached, but does not include seed, unless specifically mentioned, nor manufactured products of plants, nor anything mentioned in this definition which has been cooked;

"pest" means any insect or other invertebrate animal which may be injurious to agricultural or horticultural crops;

"plant disease" means any disease caused by fungus, bacterium, virus, or other organism which may be injurious to agricultural or horticultural crops;

"container" means any box, basket, pot, package, barrel, parcel, case or other receptacle or covering;

"covering" means covering of a plant or of a container.

Power of Governor in Council to make regulations.

3. (1) The Governor in Council may make regulations for all or any of the following purposes -

> prohibiting, restricting, or regulating the importation (a) into the Colony of plants, vegetables, seeds, soils, manure, containers, straw, or other packing material or any other similar goods or things;

- (b) prescribing or designating the authority which may prescribe the conditions on which any such goods or things referred to in the preceding paragraph, may be imported into the Colony, including conditions to become operative after importation;
- (c) prescribing the places at which any such goods or things may be imported into the Colony when not imported by post;
- (d) providing for the detention and examination of any such goods or things on their importation into the Colony;
- (e) providing for the destruction of any such goods or things which on importation are found to be infected with any plant disease or pest or for their treatment by the Department of Agriculture or otherwise, and for the similar treatment of any such goods or things, as a precautionary measure, whether found to be infected or not;
- (f) eradicating pests or plant diseases, preventing or controlling their attacks, or preventing their spread or distribution within the Colony;
- prescribing the fees and charges to be paid in respect (g)of any act or thing done under any regulation;
- (h) generally for giving effect to the objects of this Ordinance.

(2) Any regulation made under this section may be limited in its application to goods or things coming from particular countries and such countries may either be specified in the regulation or in a notice by the Governor relating to the regulation and published in the Gazette.

4. No person shall introduce, or cause to be introduced, into Prohibition on the inthe Colony any living pests in any stage of development, or living cultures of fungi or bacteria that are parasitic on plants, or dried specimens of plant diseases, without the written permission of the Governor previously obtained.

5. In addition to any fine or term of imprisonment which Penalties. may be imposed for a contravention of any regulation made under this Ordinance the court may order that the goods or things in respect of which the offence has been committed be forfeited and disposed of as the court may direct.

### To amend the Live Stock Ordinance, 1901.

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of the Falkland Islands, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof as follows:-

Short Title.

**Repeal of Section 19** of No. 6 of 1901.

And when driving sheep.

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Live Stock (Amendment) Ordinance, 1944.

2. Section 19 of the Live Stock Ordinance, 1901, is hereby repealed and the following section substituted -

19. No person shall drive any sheep upon or across any station without -

- (a) the drover having in his possession a way-bill stating the number, description and markings of the sheep, and signed by the owner or vendor of the sheep;
- giving notice to the owner of such station in writing (b) not less than twenty-four hours and not more than three days before such driving, of the intention so to do;
- (c) giving notice of the place whence and whither such sheep are being driven, and the point at which the person driving such sheep will enter such station:

Provided that the farmer may give a permit in writing waiving, either absolutely or upon such terms as are stated in the permit, his claim to receive from any other farmer any notice required to be given by this or the preceeding section:

Provided also that any farmer or Inspector may examine and count such travelling sheep and check them with the way-bill which must be produced on request.

### A Bill

To make better provision for Cinematograph Exhibitions.

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of the Falkland Islands, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof as follows:-

Short Title.

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Cinematograph Ordinance, 1944.

Provision against cinematograph exhibition except in licensed premises.

2. An exhibition of pictures or other optical effects by means of a cinematograph, or other similar apparatus, for the purposes of

which inflammable films are used, shall not be given unless the regulations made by the Governor in Council for securing safety are complied with, or, save as otherwise expressly provided by this Ordinance, elsewhere than in premises licensed for the purpose in accordance with the provisions of this Ordinance.

3. (1) The Governor may grant licences to such persons Provisions as to as he thinks fit to use the premises specified in the licence for the licences. purpose aforesaid on such terms and conditions and under such restrictions as, subject to regulations of the Governor in Council, the Governor may by the respective licences determine.

(2) A licence shall be in force for one year or for such shorter period as the Governor on the grant of the licence may determine, unless the licence has been previously revoked as hereinafter provided.

(3) The Governor may transfer any licence granted by him to such other person as he thinks fit.

(4) An applicant for a licence or transfer of a licence shall give not less than seven days' notice in writing to the Governor and to the Chief Constable of his intention to apply for a licence or transfer:

Provided that it shall not be necessary to give any notice where the application is for the renewal of an existing licence held by the applicant for the same premises.

(5) There shall be paid in respect of the grant, renewal. or transfer of a licence such fees as the Governor may fix. not exceeding in the case of a grant or renewal for one year one pound, or in the case of a grant or renewal for any less period five shillings for every month for which it is granted or renewed, so however that the aggregate of the fees payable in any year shall not exceed one pound, or, in the case of transfer, five shillings.

4. If the owner of a cinematograph or other apparatus uses Penalties. the apparatus, or allows it to be used, or if the occupier of any premises allows those premises to be used, in contravention of the provisions of this Ordinance or the regulations made thereunder, or of the conditions or restrictions upon or subject to which any licence relating to the premises has been granted under this Ordinance, he shall be liable on summary conviction, to a fine not exceeding twenty pounds, and in the case of a continuing offence to a further penalty of five pounds for each day during which the offence continues, and the licence (if any) shall be liable to be revoked by the Governor.

5. A constable or any officer appointed for the purpose by the Governor may at all reasonable times enter any premises, whether licensed or not, in which he has reason to believe that such an exhibition as aforesaid is being or is about to be given, with a view to seeing whether the provisions of this Ordinance, or any regulations made thereunder, and the conditions of any licence granted under this Ordinance, have been complied with, and, if any person prevents or obstructs the entry of a constable or any officer appointed as aforesaid, he shall be liable, on summary conviction, to a penalty not exceeding twenty pounds.

6. This Ordinance shall not apply to an exhibition given in a private dwelling-house or premises to which the public are not admitted, whether on payment or otherwise.

7. (1) The Governor in Council shall make regulations for Regulations. securing safety at any exhibition of pictures or other optical effects by means of a cinematograph, or other similar apparatus, for which inflammable films are used.

(2) The Governor in Council may, from time to time, make regulations, including regulations as to costs and fees, for carrying this Ordinance into effect.




