I beg to submit a list of articles salvaged from the S/S "Gubernoren" which have been stored in the Customs Warehouse and which may be auctioned.

1	1 Cabin toilet stand fitted with hand <del>mirror</del> basin and mirror.	Estimated max. price	£11
2	1 Boats spirit Compass	-----do-----	" £3
3	3 Coils Rope, (if 2½" or under)	-----do-----	" £33
4	2 Bolts of Canvas	-----do-----	" £20
5	4 Drums Anti-fouling paint	-----do-----	" £16
6	1 Coil of grass line	-----do-----	" £15

There would appear to be every chance of these articles being procured at a very much reduced price than that estimated.

Items 1 - 4 and 6 would be for the Patrol Vessel and Item No5 for use in the Marine Dept in connection with the maintenance of Sanitary punts and other boats.
