I beg to report for the information of H.E. the Administrator that John Davis of the Cutter "Indiana" when entering at the Customs this afternoon reported that this morning at about 2 a.m., when about 3 miles east of Port Harriett Point he observed 2 vessels light about one mile distant from his Cutter - Davis states that he saw the light for about 10 minutes when it disappeared - vessel was not showing any riding lights. Weather at the time was thick.

2. No local vessels have been cleared or entered at the Customs in the last two days other than the cutter "Indiana".
