I have the honour to inform Your Excellency that the training ship "Juan Sebastian Elcano" of the Spanish navy desires to visit, in an unofficial manner, and during a training voyage, the following ports under British jurisdiction:-

Port Stanley, from the 4th to the 7th November 1935,

Cape of Good Hope, from the 12th to the

December 1935,

Lagon, from the 18th to the 21st January, 1936,

Kingston from the 19th to the 23rd March, 1936,

Halifax, from the 2nd to the 8th May, 1936.

I shall be grateful if Your Excellency will be good enough to inform me whether there is any objection to the training ship visiting these ports on the dates specified.
