3 The estimate for the "Afterglow" is based on the consumption of 16 men.

Scale of Provisions for the Patrol Vessel and the Rookery Guards.

Reference Numbers. }

Sir,

I beg to submit the attached Scale of Provisions for the victualling of the Patrol Vessel and the Guards.

The victualling rate per man per day would from this Scale appear to work out at about 3/5 per day for the Island Guards, the Patrol Vessel having a larger number of persons to be victualled tends to reduce the rate very considerably.

Whilst the Patrol Vessel is in Stanley the rate is greatly reduced owing to the crew, though being victualled on board, do not, in the majority of cases ~~partake~~ partake of food on board.

During the time the Patrol Vessel is on Patrol duty a quantity of Vegetables, milk etc are procured by members of the crew from residents on the coast which further reduces the apparent rate.

It would, thus, appear that the rate of victualling of the Patrol Vessel and the Guards will on the total work out at about 2/9 to 3/- per man per diem.
