to which you replied as follows:

"Your telegram 19th December it would appear that owner's boat should comply with requirements the Port authorities and obtain temporary services of some person competent to navigate vessel Stanley. Colonial Secretary".

2. In view of these messages it now appears that the matter is at a deadlock. I gather from your reply that neither Bundes nor MacLeod are certificated navigators, consequently the final arrangements of this matter is at present, not clear.
