Sir,

I have to report that two firemen, Frank Wilson and David Castle, ex s.s. "Philomel", Official Number 164575, were sent under Conveyance Order from Port Stanley, Falkland Islands, in the s.s. "Fitzroy" on the 20th. July 1940, and arrived at this port on August 2nd.

Column 14 of page 1 of Form C.16 had not been completed by the Shipping Master at Port Stanley, but Firemen Wilson and Castle claimed that they were entitled to £42.5.9 and £35.7.5 respectively on account of wages, and, in support of their contention, produced letters from the Master of the s.s. "Philomel" to the Secretary of the General Steam Mavigation Company, authorising the payment to the two men of the above amounts. This arrangement, however, did not suit them; they had some time to spend in port here before continuing their journey, and they (and I) knew of no reason why settlement of wages should be withheld until they reached London.

On the 3rd. August I accordingly sent a radiogram to the Colonial Secretary at Port Stanley requesting confirmation from the Shipping Master that these sums were due to the firemen concerned, and, on receiving a reply in the affirmative, I completed Column 14 on page 1 (and also page 3) of Form C.16 and proceeded to pay Wilson and Castle the amounts due to them, while retaining in my keeping the letters of authority to the Secretary of the General Steam Navigation Company.

Copy of this communication has been sent to the Colonial Secretary, Falkland Islands, for information.

I have the honour to report that a nextu of four officers and sixteen scomen sprived in Montevideo on the 7th. Nov 1941 in the s.s. "Tuscan Stan" on route for the Palkland Talands, where they are to The owners of this ship, the General יוו במיח ווחפוי, ביד בין מיחו Steam Westingtion Co., London, have foiled, however to make any erronnements, either with this Consulate or with the acents of the Talkland Talanda Commons in Hontevideo League, Maclean & Stanladon, for obvances of waces to be made to those men during their stoy in Conterided. According to a new Arragment carried by the sanion officer in the party and at arragent in my custody, both officers hoth officers and men were engaged in Livergool on the 7th. April 1941 and there one one month's wodes, plus Wor Ronus, less advances on joining and allotments, were due to them. Since none of the neutr had one momes for pormal expenses during their step in this nort. T necondingly decided to advance them morey on my own magneralitity.

After the initial advances were unde, learns, Maclean & Stepledon received instructions from the Malkland Islands Company to advance s total sum of 655.0.0, and this sum was accombinate refunded to me by them. On further requesting outhorisation to renow the belance due to me, at that time 665.0.0. Hosans. Maclean & Stonledon were informed that no further educates were to be made by them.

Since, however, it was amparent from the inticles that the men still had credit halarces or their account weres. I comsented, on their express symbiostion, to make Cuuther advances amounting in all to 239.5.3. and in bringing the matter to Your Excellency's notice I have to request that, should there be no objection, arrangements may be made whereby the amount still due to this Consulate, namely 9104.5.3 one hundred and four nounds, five chillings and threamence, may be refunded at the earliest conortunity, together with the amount nevable for board and lodging, the exact total of which will be communicated to you in due course. Particulars of the advances made at this Conculate, amounting to \$159.5.3. form the enclosure to this desmitch.

I wenture also to noint out that, had the owners of the s.s. "Philomel" taken steps to make proper provision for these men to receive edvances during their enforced stay in Montavideo, justifiable discontent on the part of the crew and considerable embarrasement to this Consulate would have been avoided. The men are due to sail to-day in the s.s. "Fitzroy" for Port Stanley.
