2. The C^o should take the bulk over now and make the store weather proof if this can be done at little expense?
3. Until the use to which the bulk is to be put can be definitely allocated is it possible to charge the purchase to the P.W. D Underwriting Store Account. The covering sanction of the A.O.P. to the purchase might be sought by despatch?
4. I do not know what documents for execution by the Director were prepared but if the Company is now paid £200 the manager's receipt will conclude the contract and sale. I have spoken to Mr. Gosselin and he will be satisfied with this.

I visited the hulk with Mr. Challen (Foreman New works) a few days ago: he considers that (1) it would be a great advantage if all materials for Stanley Improvement works could be landed at one place & separately from stores consigned to the various departments. The Crown agents in enclosure (2) in Mr. 612/24 have been instructed that all packages of materials for the work are to be ^{clearly} marked S.I.S.: the packages can be easily distinguished by this mark & arrangements can be made with F.I. Co for them to be landed at Sullivan Street Jetty. Much labour will be saved in sorting them out when landed, from stores for various departments.

(2) Storage accommodation is now required for all materials which will be received at the hulk with hold all stores which ought to be under cover: the hulk will be very useful for this purpose. Considerable saving in transport will be effected as instead of materials being taken up to the depot in Magazine valley for storage & later transported to the places where they are required they can be distributed direct from the hulk.

(3) The hull is a store + the jitty are

2. I am advising my Directors that the jetty and hulk, in situ, are, as far as I can foresee, unlikely to be of use to the Company and I have therefore recommended that they should be sold to the Government if they are desirous of purchasing, or, that the jetty material, which is still in a good state of preservation, should be removed and utilized for repairs to our other jetties.

3. It may be added that there is no immediate necessity for a decision as the work of removal would not be commenced for several months.






