Sir.

I beg to lay before you a proposition, as regards the protection of small open Boats, at present moored in the Harbour, against Winter gales, As no doubt you are aware, two Motor Boats sank last winter, Mr. A. Steel's and my own, and it was due to the kind generosity of the Govt + Penguin's crew, that the Boats were salvaged, and it amounted to a lot of labour in cleaning of engines through salt water getting into them, and in my own case several pounds to repair the boat. I beg therefore to propose, that, the piece of land, which, appears to be unused at present, east of the Govt Slipway to the shed used by the Electrical Department, be utilized for the laying up of small Boats for the winter, as with little alteration this piece of land would accommodate eight Boats the size of my own Boat. I have the honour to inform you that His Excellency the Governor has been pleased to consider favourably your application dated the 29th of October, 1934, for facilities for the laying up of small craft.


2. The site mentioned in your application is being prepared for use accordingly and will be available at the commencement of next winter.
