- (b) Lantern House to be wire brushed and chipped where required.
- (c) Hard-rails, ladder, guards, platform and gas-house to be wire brushed and chipped.
- (d) Tower, gas-house, hand-rails, ladder md platform to be given two coats of Graphite paint.
- (e) Lantern Souse to be given two coats of "hite paint.
- (f) Interior of gas-house and doors to be given two coats of White paint.
- g) Exterior of hut to be wire brushed and walls to be either iven two coats of Craphite paint.

All tools, risging rear and material will be supplied by the Covernment and the Contractors will convey same to the Power and, on completion of the work, will return all tools, rigging sear and surplus material to the Dookward Setty as part of their Contract.
