

The procedure adopted in each case is that a Clearance is prepared by Collector of Customs; Stanley and signed by a Justice of Peace at the station where the vessel clears from, the seals on bonded stores are also checked.

The Falkland Islands Company on the attached request now ask for permission to "Enter" their vessel at Port Howard on her return voyage from Funta Arenas in April. I am of the opinion that this request should not be granted for the

following reasons.

- Justices of the Peace (usually Camp Managers) connot be expected to rummage through passengers baggage and Orew effects, check bonded stores and seal them up effectively .
- For the necessary Pratique it would mean that (b) the Medical Officer usually stationed at Fox Bay would have to ride to Port Howard to clear vessel unless Senior Medical Officer is prepared to grant Pratique by "Radio."
- "Port of Entry" is clearly defined in Ordinance (c)No 1 of 1943 as Stanley and Fox Bay and I can see no reason why "Fitzroy" should not call at Fox Bay for elearance on her way to Port Howard, on her inward voyage.
- Finally, I consider it leaves the gateway open to any "monkey business" the Grev or Passengers may (a)try in the absence of proper Justoms supervision.

I would be grateful therefore, for your guidance on this matter.

From the Customs point of view and providing the Government are in agreement, arrangements could be made for the Customs Officer to be flown to San Carlos to meet the "Fitzroy". The passengers disembarking would come under proper Customs Supervision and I could then carry on to Fox Bay and return to Stanley in the "Fitzroy". If your fears prove correct regarding us being termed Islas Malvinas, Argentine, I personally would not be prepared without higher authority to refuse her entry after travelling approx. 1000 miles to get here. From what I can see, as long as the Captain is in a position to produce the required papers, he cannot be denied entry. I would be prepared to erase the word "Argentine" and take a chance on the mossible consequences, and as the cargo is for the Government, let them sort it out afterwards with the B.A. authorities if anything should arise. As however the Captain will no doubt be an "old bird" on the 3th. American trade, I fully expect that he will see to it that his papers etc. are made out for the Falkland Is. as a British port. I regret having to be so vague in my replies, but cannot find anything in this office to guide me, except a very brief note by the C. of C. setting out what papers must be produced on arrival and what papers to issue on departure of ships from here. 

The attached letter, received from the Shipping Department of the F.I.C. seeks permission to clear the "Fitzroy" at Port San Carlos and enter at Darwin. Assuming Government will again grant a remission of export tax on Live Sheep I beg to submit for your approval the following recommendations.

- 1. The "Fitzroy" be cleared at Port San Carlos by the Justice of the Peace residing in that area. All papers will be prepared in Stanley by the Collector of Customs, and all required of the J.P. will be to sign the Clearance and check seals on "Ships Bond".
- 2. Arrangements be made for Customs Officer to fly to Darwin to meet the vessel on her return from Punta Arenas. There are several passengers making the round trip who will be disembarking at Darwin, and the presence of a Customs Officer is in my opinion most essential. The Officer to return to Stanley on "Fitzroy".

Although the Customs Ordinance defines Ports of Entry as Fox Bay and Stanley I think the services of the Customs should be extended wherever practicable.

"80. No person whether a passenger or not, shall disembark or go ashore from or go on board any aircraft or ship that shall have arrived within the Golony or the waters thereof, save at such times, by such means, and by such ways as may be prescribed in any regulations made under this Ordinance, or otherwise as the Gollector may allow.".

2. A visitor who arrived recently on official Government business in H.M.S. "Lounts Bay" was disembarked without having complied with the necessary Customs formalities. There was a misunderstanding in this particular instance but Heads of Departments are requested to inform the Collector of Customs when persons visiting the Colony on business connected with their departments are expected to arrive in vessels other than those engaged in scheduled passenger voyages.

Dear Sir,
With reference to the incident on the ATS Saturday evening when she arrived, and in which the Customs Officer, Mr. Crierson, Demanded me to, GET OFF THE VESSEL, I think I am entitled to an apology from him. I am an Agent for the Farmers and was there to collect Labourers, and I had a permit from the FIC to go on board the vessel after she was cleared. As you know Dr. Slessor came down the ganguay and told you and your Wife that the ship was cleared, and in the hearing of Police Constable Felton. Directly you went on board I followed like many others and went to speak to some of the men whom I was to get. Mr. Grierson asked me what I was doing on the boat, I said to collect

labourers, then he said, get off the vessel, I said I am on board to get the labourers, then in a most brutal manner he shouted out, I demand you to get off the vessel, I then went on shore but before doing so I reported the incident to you, at the same time I noticed that everyone else was still on board. I think Mr. Grierson forgets he is a Public Servant and should

treat people in a more respectful manner.

I am very conscious at all times that the Customs (and Excise) Officers job is primarily the protection of the Revenue. Practically all his official actions are based in the final analysis on the Law behind him, which he is there to uphold.

Under section 80 of the Customs Ordinance "No person whether a passenger or not, shall disembark or go ashore from or go onboard any aircraft or ship that shall have arrived within the Colony or the waters thereof, save at such times, by such means, and by such ways as may be prescribed in any regulation made under this ordance, or otherwise as the Collector may allow".

It is the practice for F.I.C. ships to allow the Manager F.I.C., Shipping Clerk, Mail Officer and Agricultural Officer (if animals are onboard) to board the vessel before she is cleared. The Constable on duty at the gangway is given his tenstructions either by me or my assistant that the vessel is cleared. This is the first occasion that I have ever known for the S.M.O. to give instructions.

The Agricultural Officer was inspecting the animals and both my assistant and I was busily engaged in inspecting baggage and checking bonded stores when Mr.Peck appeared. At the time he was the only person I saw and I told him the vessel was not cleared and ordered him ashore. (An order yes, but not brutal by any means).

I am also to add that I consider it necessary to keep a watchful eye on certain Merchants who think the Customs Laws are not applicable to them. During my 33 years service in Government I have always been conscious of the fact that I am a Public Servant.
