Sir,

I have the honour to inform you that enquiries have recently been received from Ottawa as to the best means of securing that the Commercial Intelligence Service of the Department of Trade and Commerce, Canada (which has recently started a special Tariff Division), shall be kept informed as to the Tariffs in force in the Colonies and Protectorates, and as to any alterations in, or revisions of, these Tariffs.

2. I understand that the necessary particulars as to tariffs are already supplied by certain Colonial Governments, but, in other cases, the most convenient procedure would seem to be for the Governments concerned to make arrangements for direct interchange with the Canadian Government of the information required, and I shall be glad if you will take the necessary action.
