Sir,

As a result of Your Excellency's approval to employ Simms' men on a casual labour basis, it has been possible to get the jobs listed completed in three and a half weeks. Some of these jobs would have required many months work by our own limited staff - and even then would not have the finish as given by these experienced Tradesmen.

ROADS. Levelled and shingled approach roads to New Discovery House and sections of the road to Jetty - in all about 350 yards.

TELEPHONES. Trenching in 700 yards of 25 pair/10.lb. twin type Telephone Cable.
Fitting and connecting 11 Junction Boxes.
Internal wiring for 14 Telephones.
Fitting and connecting Automatic Exchange System.
Assembling and charging Batteries.
Connecting to Junction Box and fitting portable Telephone for use of ships at Jetty.
This completes installation of King Edward Point Telephone System which is working very efficiently.

FOOD STORE UNDER NEW DISCOVERY HOUSE.
Digging out and concreting foundation for Food Store 32 feet by 16 feet.
Laying brickwork up to Damp Course level.
Timber framing with Asbestos sheeting outside and Plywood sheeting inside - all insulated - door and window fitted. Electric Light and Power Points fitted. Floor levelled, shingled and duck-boards laid around all walls.

Store Room exterior painted to match existing building.

Assistance also rendered in moving stores from old Sheds

BOOK SHELVES. 16 Book Shelves made, painted and fitted in 16 bedrooms in New Discovery House.

BILLIARD TABLE. From two dismantled tables, selected best of each and assembled one good Billiard Table. Table slates and cushions repaired. Baize fitted, stretched and ironed to position. Completed Table set in position on the Recreation Room in New Discovery House. Cue rack also fitted on wall.

TABLE TENNIS TABLE. Complete new Table made and set in position in the Recreation Room in New Discovery House.

DART BOARD. Dart Board with protection back-board and score-board fitted in Recreation Room.

OLD DISCOVERY HOUSE. All exterior doors fitted with Bolts and Padlocks.

RAILWAY LINES. 100 Yards disused railway lines cut into suitable lengths and removed for storage near Jetty.

SITE HUT. Removing all surplus stores and spare equipment from Site Hut on Rifle Range and re-storing in Old Discovery Store Sheds.

Dismantling and transporting Site Hut to new site near Jetty. Excavating and levelling site and re-erecting hut - roof re-felted.

JETTY SEA WALL. Repairing existing wall by strengthening, concreting breakwater, and back filling with cement. Protruding steel plates cut off at ground level.

POWER STATION. Two Joiners, two Plumbers and three Heating Engineers employed on alterations to existing building and moving into position and erecting new Engine and auxiliary installations in new section of building. All work under the supervision of Mr. Quigley.

The foregoing work was completed with a labour force of 16 men and the cost of each job is given below, the hours quoted may be compared with the Time Sheets attached :-

ROADS. 4 Men employed, working a total of 185 man-hours (at 8/- . = £74).

TELEPHONES. 6 Men employed, working a total of 551½ man-hours (at 8/- . = £220/12/-).

FOOD STORE UNDER NEW HOUSE. 7 Men employed, working a total of 347 man-hours (at 8/- = £138/16/-).

BOOK SHELVES. 2 Men employed, working a total of 55 man-hours (at 8/- = £22.)

GAMES EQUIPMENT INSTALLED IN NEW RECREATION ROOM.
2 Men employed for a total of 114 man-hours at 8/- per hour = £45/12/-.

REMOVING OLD RAILS & SUNDRY ODD JOBS. Total of 40 man-hours at 8/- = £16.

REMOVAL OF SITE HUT. 8 men employed, working a total of 178½ man-hours at 8/- = £71/8/-.

JETTY SEA-WALL; 5 Men employed, working a total of 114 man-hours at 8/- . = £45/12/-.

POWER HOUSE. Total of 8 men employed, working a total of 485½ man-hours at 8/- . = £194/4/-.

The total expenditure during the period of three and a half weeks, including the payment for 150 hours to the Supervisor not included above, was £888. 4s. -d. which we have been able to meet from subhead B. 2. Maintenance of Works and Buildings without any additional provision required.
