Sir,

I am directed by the Governor to forward to you herewith the accompanying copy of correspondence with the Colonial Office, regarding the desire of a Spanish subject resident in South Georgia, to acquire British naturalization.

2. In the event of the applicant making his application through you, and not direct to the Governor, unnecessary delay will be avoided if you follow the procedure indicated in paragraph 5 of the Dispatch of the 24th November, 1929, sending him the enclosed copy of the Instructions (A) and obtaining from him his formal memorial and the declaration in support thereof.

3. A copy of certificate (A) is also enclosed for your guidance in the matter of the particulars required from the applicant. The Oath of Allegiance in the form prescribed on the back of the certificate should not be taken until approval of the application has been obtained from the Secretary of State.
