Salvesen's have arranged for S.S. "Struan" to ship requirements of Salvesen's and Lochen Companies. Vessel understood to be loading at Sydney Nova Scotia coal cargo about 3700 tons.

2. With regard to coke 300 tons plus 60 tons referred to in your telegram No. 424 arranged for shipment by same vessel from Hampton Roads. Difficulty over issue of United States of America export licence being experienced but strong representations made and issue expected shortly.

3. Further to my telegram No. 273 coal supplies for F.I.D.S. have now been satisfactorily arranged and 62 tons anthracite and 10 tons household coal, for 7 bases, are now being loaded at London in accordance with instructions issued by Bingham. Admiralty are acting as agents and in this special case exporting from United Kingdom approved.

4. Crown Agents recently reported receipt of your Indent 1/37/47 dated July 7th for 6 tons Phurnacite for Public Works Department. Owing to restrictions on export of United Kingdom coal and the other solid fuels Salvesen's were asked if they would include this requirement in "Struan" cargo on your behalf. They have agreed to do so but point out "Struan" will not call at Port Stanley en route to South Georgia and local arrangements should be made to tranship this phurnacite from South Georgia.





Sir,

With reference to item 1 of indent number I/37/47, for the supply of 6 tons of Phurnacite for Esse Cookers, we have the honour to inform you that owing to the present restriction on export of solid fuels from the United Kingdom, it is quite impossible for us to arrange for the supply of this item from this country.

We understand from the Colonial Office, however, that arrangements are in hand, through Messrs A. Salversen and Company to load coal at Nova Scotia to meet the requirements of the Whaling Companies at Falkland Is. and South Georgia, and also the possibility of shipping a cargo of coke from U.S.A. is being explored through the same source. In the circumstances the Colonial Office have requested Messrs Salversens to endeavour to arrange for the supply of 6 tons of fuel suitable for use in Esse cookers for shipment with either of the above cargoes from Nova Scotia or U.S.A., and we will advise you of the result as soon as further information is available.
