IMPROVED SANITATION FOR THE ROMAN CATHOLIC SCHOOL
AND SISTER'S QUARTERS.

I beg to report that the Reverend L.M. Migone has requested that certain improvements be carried out to the sanitary system of the Roman Catholic school and the Sister's quarters. Verbal approval was given for this by the Honourable J.M. Ellis, O.B.E., for the work to be carried out by this Department as a private charge. An estimate, amounting to £122, has been supplied and accepted by the Reverend L.M. Migone.

2. Owing to the school holidays the earth closets, etc, are not required, and Father Migone has requested that the work should be put in hand and the W.C's etc installed whilst the children are away; to enable this to be carried out I have put the work in hand.

It is proposed to charge the work against the Unallocated Store Account and to recover the money by monthly instalments, and it is anticipated that the account will be settled by the end of 1934, and I submit that approval be given for the action taken.

3. Whenever possible it has been the policy of the Government in the past to assist the Reverend L.M. Migone with works by allowing as much as possible and convenient without detriment to Government work to be carried out by General Warrant labour, and I submit that this may apply to the work in hand.

4. To cheapen the work second hand materials will be used wherever possible. It is proposed to demolish the disused street lamp store at present in the gaol yard
and

and use the serviceable materials for constructing
the building to house the boy's W.C's and urinals -
the Reverend L. Wigone of course paying a reasonable
price for the materials salved from this.

Submitted please. The Reverend L.M. Migone is desirous of having all his property painted. I have assisted him by measuring up the work and pricing same.

2. On occasions in the past it has been the practice for the Government to carry out work and allow Father Migone to pay for it by instalments at the rate of approximately £10 per month. With regard to this proposed work he now hopes that it may be possible for the same practice to continue.

3. The value of the work is £162. I am willing, subject to your approval, to arrange for the supervision and engage on piecework rates or contract unemployed men only.

4. If the proposals are approved it will also be necessary to ask approval for the issue of an Advance Warrant in the sum of £162.
