- 2. Mr Burms not having had previous experience in this class of work did not realize the amount of labour required to procure sufficient stone for this work, neither did he allow for delays due to bad weather, consequently he under estimated the value of the work.
- 3 Mr Burnes informs me that he is over £30 down on the contract, making the cost to him over £90. I considered, at the time the contract was placed, that the tender was too low and spoke to Mr Barnes on the question.
- 4. With a view to encouraging contractors I would suggest for favourable consideration that Mr Barnes be granted £IO over his contract price; this amount being given as compensation to him for unfavourable weather conditions during the course of the work; making a total of £70 for whole work.


