Sir,

I have the honour to ask that inquiry may be made of the Admiralty whether they have any objection to the Colonial Government being supplied with 400 drums, of about 400 lbs. each, from the stock of Cement at Navy Point, Port Stanley, the Colonial Government to pay at the rate of 10/- to 11/6 a drum, as may be fixed by the Admiralty.

2. It is estimated that there are about 900 drums of 400 lbs. each, and 700 drums of 200 lbs. each, of cement stacked in the open at Navy Point. This cement remains over from the supply sent out for the works on the Naval Wireless Telegraph Station, and as the buildings are completed is not likely to be further required for the Station. Being stacked in the open the cement I understand is liable to perish, and it may be a convenience to the Admiralty, as it will be to the Colonial Government, if the Government may be supplied with at least 400 drums.
