- J. The Government allows ten holidays in the year, eight of which are paid, and in this year two days extra in Stock Show week were granted on full pay, in addition to this twenty-two P. W. D. employees, members of the Defence Force, received full pay and board while on summer training for ten days, which can hardly be classed as labour.

With reference to the workmen from this Department seconded to the F.I.C. for work on Admiralty Oil Tanks, one of these men has just returned to the Department Pay Roll and has asked for his weeks holiday. It occurs to me that when the remainder are released they will make a similar demand and this will have to be granted and I submit that the Government should not have to bear this cost. May the question be raised formally please. I would suggest when a man has been employed by them for over 9 months the cost of his holiday pay should be borne by them and they notify this department of any leave so granted.

The case is similar to the Government contribution to the Provident Fund which I asked the Treasury to raise and which I believe has already been settled.

Referring to your conference with the Hon.

Colonial Secretary on the above matter. I understand that it was then tentatively agreed that your Company were prepared to contribute towards the pay of men seconded from this department while on holiday, in proportion to the time they have been with you in the year. I would be glad of your confirmation of this arrangement.

In anticipation of your concurrence and in order to prevent any possible abuse of the privilege I suggest the following procedure be closely followed.

- 1. On application for holiday the case be referred here for check that holiday has not already been granted this year.
- 2. When holiday is granted subject to 1. that this office be notified commencing date.
- 3. For purposes of calculating proportion payable by your Company and Government year to be treated as 52 weeks.

Please accept my thanks for your co-operation in this matter.
